

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Wisdom 9:13-18b

Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the LORD intends? For the deliberations of mortals are timid, and unsure are our plans. For the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns. And scarce do we guess the things on earth, and what is within our grasp we find with difficulty; but when things are in heaven, who can search them out? Or who ever knew your counsel, except you had given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus were the paths of those on earth made straight.

I, Paul, an old man, and now also a prisoner for Christ Jesus, urge you on behalf of my child Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment; I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I should have liked to retain him for myself, so that he might serve me on your behalf in my imprisonment for the gospel, but I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that the good you do might not be forced but voluntary. Perhaps this is why he was away from you for a while, that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a

a brother, beloved especially to me, but even more so to you, as a man and in the Lord. So if you regard me as a partner, welcome him as you would me.

Gospel - Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

From Fr. Mike's Desk

This coming Monday, September 5th, we as a nation will celebrate Labor Day. It is the last unofficial weekend of the summer, and as I always thought, a kid's worse nightmare. Why, because in a matter of a few days a new school year begins. Even if you like school, there are still a lot of questions, fears, and pressure as we start our first day of school. Well kids, we all had to go through it, and we survived, so will you. On Labor Day we honor those who conduct all honest labor which helps build society and, likewise, the Kingdom of God. Labor is one of the factors of production, which are necessary to produce all goods and services. The other two factors are land and capital, and as mentioned, all three combine to make things happen. But there is a theory (more like a fact) in economics that resources, and labor are limited, and this leaves us with the problem of scarcity. This is because our wants and needs seem to us to be unlimited. Thus, we must decide how we are going to apply the three factors, what are we going to produce, and what services are we going to provide.

Today, Jesus also discusses the problem of scarcity in our own lives. This scarcity does not come about by using the factors of production, but from the limits that this life gives us. This is the scarcity which comes from our hearts and souls as we must decide to whom or what should we give them. Jesus tells the crowds, who were traveling with Him (as He was making His way to Jerusalem for the last time), "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife, children... and even his own life he cannot be my disciple." These are very harsh words from our savior, words that we would not expect from the God who is love. What could He mean? Indeed, hate is a strong word, and in the original language, hate is not the word that is used here. The word used means if you put people's circumstances, and desires before Christ, we are failing to give God our whole heart and soul. To be a true disciple, we are to always put Jesus first. We must not allow the thoughts and concerns of this world to interfere with our true devotion, and how well we follow the Gospel. We all know well how circumstances or occurrences can distract, and even separate us from our faith. We also know that others can do the same things to us. Sometimes these others are the ones closest to us who may force us to decide if we will follow their demands and ways, which are contrary to Christ. Sometimes it is people in authority, our leaders, or employers. And let us not forget the craziness of this world: COVID, supply disruptions and all sorts of shortages. We wonder when is this, going to end, and then we wonder if God is

He is, but remember that Jesus tells us we must carry our own cross and be willing to accept the sacrifices we must make, to be His disciples.

We are to totally consider the cost and know, that no matter what we must give up in this world, we will gain so much more in the next. Whatever sadness we encounter in this world, Christ will be our consolation, and our guide. His guidance will help with the problem of scarcity. We must renounce all our possessions which means we must use them wisely and not allow them to use us.

Happy Labor Day, happy first day of school, and let us pray that as we enter a new school year, things will be brand new.

Starting next Sunday, we will start bringing up the gifts at the Offertory and restoring the sign of peace before we receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. To help us to continue to do this we need more young people to become Altar Servers. If you are entering 4th grade or over this would be a suitable time to consider serving the Lord at the Altar. It is a wonderful ministry, and it is vitally important for the celebration of Mass. Pray about it!



Registration Info for the 2022-2023 School Year




St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year religious education program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their formation classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy

Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2.

Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and then their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation study years for students in their religious education.

Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.



In person Religious Education Classes will begin the week of September 25th.



Families whose children were already enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year should have received a Registration Email on June 8th. The registration emails were sent out again last week. If you have not yet registered and still have not received this registration email, kindly contact Mrs. Braun by either emailing her at abraun@st-edwards.org or by calling 516-921-8543.


