The Readings for the Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - Isaiah 35:4-7a

Thus says the LORD:

Say to those whose hearts are frightened:

Be strong, fear not!

Here is your God,

he comes with vindication;

with divine recompense

he comes to save you.

Then will the eyes of the blind be opened,

the ears of the deaf be cleared;

and the thirsty ground, springs of water.

My brothers and sisters, show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. For if a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Sit here, please," while you say to the poor one, "Stand there," or "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?

Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?

Again Jesus left the district of Tyre and went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, into the district of the Decapolis. And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment and begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "*Ephphatha!*" — that is, "*Be opened!*" — And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly. He ordered them not to tell anyone. But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."



From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Thus says the Lord: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, He comes with vindication; with divine recompense He comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared..."

"He put his finger into the man's ears and spitting, touched his tongue than he looked up to heaven and groaned and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is 'Be opened!'"

The Prophet Isaiah tells the people not to worry, for God will do what seems amazing and the world will be totally changed. This prophecy certainly refers to the time when these events were happening or in the near future, when God set His people free from the Babylonian Captivity, however, it also refers to what God will accomplish with the sending of His promised one. Jesus in today's gospel fulfills this prophecy when He heals the man who was deaf, and likewise, suffered from a speech impediment. Jesus brings the man into a better relationship with the people of his world as He restores the man to a fuller life. Jesus can do the same for us, healing us not only from physical illness, but also with any problems that we experience in this world, especially spiritual ones.

Notice in today's gospel Jesus ordered them not to tell anyone; but the more He ordered them not to tell, the more they told everyone. As mentioned before, this is Mark's Great Messianic Secret, as Jesus tells those who He heals to keep it a secret. But this keeping of secrets was only for the time of Our Lord's public ministry, and it was not meant to be carried out in the time following the Resurrection. Remember what Jesus told the Apostles (and the Church) as He was ascending into Heaven. He told them to go to every nation proclaiming the word and baptizing in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This keeping secret all that Jesus did was certainly not to continue after the coming of the Holy Spirit and keeping silent is not what Jesus intends for us now. And yet this seems to be a major problem for us in this great age of communication. We tend to remain silent; we resist telling others what Jesus has done for us, we fail to share with others our relationship with Him, and how He has changed our lives. Jesus could not get the people to remain quiet some 2,021 years ago, and now He cannot get them to speak. When we see the world the way it is, with so many acts of hatred, terror, and unrest, whole populations being wiped out or forced to flee their homeland, we cannot afford to remain silent!

Tomorrow (Monday) is Labor Day, and it is a day in which we honor all honest labor and all those who carry it out for the good of society and to support our families. Please pray for those who are seeking work and cannot find it and for those who are

underemployed that they will receive a proper position for which they were trained. And certainly, do not forget the great work of laboring in the harvest fields of the Lord by seeking a vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate, and Religious Life.

Next Sunday, if all goes as planned, we will be bringing back the Youth Mass and Choir. The Mass time has changed from before, we will be celebrating this Mass from now on at 6PM. The change was made to facilitate changes we hope to make in the future for the good of our young people.

We close with the prayer for the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, the patron saint of laborers; God our Father creator and ruler of the universe, in every age You call humanity to develop and use our gifts for the good of others. With Saint Joseph as our example and guide, help us to do the work You have asked and come to the rewards You have promised. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen



Registration Info for the 2021-2022 School Year




St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6

are required continuation years for students in their religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

After a year of virtual learning due to the pandemic, we are planning to resume in-school classes for religious studies this coming fall. Our scheduled opening date for Sunday classes is September 26th with weekday classes scheduled to begin the following week.



Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year, should have received a Registration Email on May 17th. These emails will be sent out again during the summer. If you did not receive this email on May 17th, please contact Mrs. Braun at abraun@st-edwards.org




