From Fr. Mike's Desk

Let us pray; Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, today we rejoice in the holy men and women of every time and place. May their prayers bring us your forgiveness and love. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen. As the above prayer tells us, today we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, which we celebrate each year on November 1st. Even when this day falls on a Sunday, it requires our full attention to its theme and to its readings. This day calls us to remember all of those who came before us. While we certainly remember all the saints who are known throughout the many centuries of the Church, today calls us to remember those who we do not know (or who are only known to us). The saints who we know are people recognized as being holy or close to God, yet remember that all who have gone before us are also considered saints.

The English word saint comes from the Latin word Sanctus which means holy. They are the great number of witnesses who even with their faults strived to keep moving closer to Christ. They surrendered themselves to God's love. The saints are our heroes who remind us that the Church is holy and can never stop being holy even when its members and leaders seem to turn from God. The Church teaches that it does not make or create saints, rather She recognizes them. Proof of virtue is regarded and is examined in the process of **beatification**. **Formal canonization** is a long process, taking many years or even centuries (there are some exceptions, i.e. Pope Saint John Paul II). There are four major steps to becoming an "Official Saint". The first is investigation of the person's life by professional investigators who send a report to the local Bishop, and if it passes the Bishop it is sent to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome. If the person is approved, he or she is given the title **Venerable**. Further investigation may lead to step three which is beatification, with the person given the title **Blessed**. Next there must be proof of a least two important miracles obtained from God through the intercession of the Blessed person, and these miracles must be done posthumously. After the three steps are completed, the move is to the fourth step which is the Pope declares that the person is a Saint and that he or she is worthy of being venerated throughout the whole Church.

Saints do more than represent a good example to follow, they also help us on our earthly journey. They pray for us (intercede), they help us present ourselves before God as we ask for their help in response to a problem or seek forgiveness for our sins. Many saints are patron saints for a country, occupation, illness, or cause (like asking St. Anthony to help find our lost keys). Of course, the greatest of all the Saints is our dear Blessed Mother. She has a special place in heaven because of the role she played in our salvation. By her saying yes to God and agreeing to be the mother of the Savior of the World, she acquired a special relationship with her Divine Son, and with us. She, as His mother, was given to us on the cross and as our loving mother she cares and prays for us. As the Queen Mother of Heaven, she serves as the chief advisor to Jesus our King. What does she advise Him on? Well that is easy, it is us; she intercedes for us before her Son, who pleads for us before God the Father.

Let us put all the saints to work for us, especially in these difficult times. Tomorrow, Monday November 2nd, which is All Souls' Day, at 7:30 PM we will have our annual Mass of Remembrance for **All Souls' Day**. At this Mass we remember especially all of those whose Funeral Mass or Service was celebrated here at St. Edward's during the past year. Their names will be announced, and you are invited to come forward to receive a flower to remember your loved ones. All are invited to this Mass even if you have not suffered a loss this past year. In addition, to have your loved ones remembered, at all of the Masses on All Souls' Day and during the month of November, please fill out and drop in the collection or drop off at the rectory, an All Souls' Envelope found in your packet.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 32 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

This year has been a year of pushbacks, postponements, and outright cancellations. Take these past few weekends here at St. Edward's. We have been doing First Communions over five weekends, with the last one being this Saturday, spreading them out so more than just a few family members can attend, without overcrowding or violating proper distancing. We did the same for the celebration of Confirmation, as we celebrated one session last Sunday and have three more to go. So many weddings and baptisms were postponed, and we now find several weddings for next year, that were originally scheduled for 2020. This certainly is understandable, and I totally agree with the couple's decision to move their wedding date. Of course, we all pray that by the time these new dates arrive, we will have more freedom and less restrictions thanks to COVID19. This year we have great concern over Halloween, as we wonder if we should allow our kids to Trick or Treat, or should we have a new observance for this year. Of course, many parents were not allowing their children to go out for several years for other safety reasons. This year Election Day has its concerns, as many people have used mail in ballots or are going to use drop off boxes for their completed ballots.

Sometimes I wake up and wonder, how much longer will we have to go through the "new normal". It would be nice if we woke up to a COVID free world, but this will not happen soon. It still looks like we have a long road ahead, and we may not see the end until a vaccine is discovered. It does seem that progress is being made, but it is most likely we will not have our prayers answered before the Spring of 2021. In many ways our journey to the end of this is like the journey of Israel during the Exodus from Egypt to the Holy Land. Unquestionably, that journey was 40 years, and I am sure we will not have to endure Corona for the same period, although at times it seems like it. During the journey, as we read through the Old Testament, we see how the people challenged Moses, complained to God, and at times were in outright rebellion. This is one of the reasons why their desert trip was so long. God knew they needed time to become a unified people, and they needed time to grow into a better relationship with God. Fortunately, we have a better relationship with God than they had, we have so much more for we have a relationship (or are working on one) with Jesus. Through Jesus we have an enhanced bond with God the Father, and by the working of the Holy Spirit we grow closer to all three persons of the Trinity and with one another (but during these times exercising proper distancing).

Even ancient Israel repented from their arguments with God and Moses, and God was able to guide them out of the desert to the land flowing with milk and honey. We too will be delivered from this time, all we need is patience, and we must never lose trust in God. God will set us free and He will not withhold His Grace and His Help.

At this time let us all say the Our Father as a promise of our trust and hope in God.

The Readings for the Solemnity of All Saints

Reading 1 - Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14

I, John, saw another angel come up from the East, holding the seal of the living God. He cried out in a loud voice to the four angels who were given power to damage the land and the sea, "Do not damage the land or the sea or the trees until we put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God." I heard the number of those who had been marked with the seal, one hundred and forty-four thousand marked from every tribe of the children of Israel.

After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb."

All the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They prostrated themselves before the throne, worshiped God, and exclaimed: "Amen. Blessing and glory, wisdom and thanksgiving, honor, power, and might be to our God forever and ever. Amen."

Then one of the elders spoke up and said to me, "Who are these wearing white robes, and where did they come from?" I said to him, "My lord, you are the one who knows." He said to me, "These are the ones who have survived the time of great distress; they have washed their robes and made them white in the Blood of the Lamb."


