

# The Readings for the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### **Reading 1 - Wisdom 6:12-16**

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. She hastens to make herself known in anticipation of their desire; Whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed, for he shall find her sitting by his gate. For taking thought of wisdom is the perfection of prudence, and whoever for her sake keeps vigil shall quickly be free from care; because she makes her own rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them in the ways, and meets them with all solicitude.

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep. Indeed, we tell you this, on the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God, will come down from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.

#### Gospel – Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus told his disciples this parable:

"The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. The foolish ones, when taking their lamps, brought no oil with them, but the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps. Since the bridegroom was long delayed, they all became drowsy and fell asleep. At midnight, there was a cry, 'Behold, the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!' Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. The foolish ones said to the wise. 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. Go instead to the merchants and buy some for yourselves.' While they went off to buy it, the bridegroom came and those who were ready went into the wedding feast with him. Then the door was locked. Afterwards the other virgins came and said, 'Lord, Lord, open the door for us!' But he said in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.'

### From Fr. Mike's Desk

We are now rapidly approaching that time of the year when we ask ourselves, are we ready for the End of the World and the Second Coming of Christ? Each day we are moving toward this event and nobody knows when it is going to happen. What I can say with certainty is that this Liturgical Year is coming to an end and the new year will begin on the weekend of November 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. But again are you ready?

Not only are you ready for Christ to come again, are you worried? Well, for me the answer can be both yes and no, or maybe even both! Yes, I am worried because I have not properly prepared, or I have not given it too much thought or keep putting it off because there is enough to occupy my time here and now. Yes, most certainly I have a lot on my mind about the here and now, especially this year and its problems. But we must keep in mind, that life here is not perfect nor is it supposed to be. So, if you are spending so much time worrying and thinking about the aspects of this temporary life, you may not be giving proper thought about the perfect life that is to come, and as a result you may not be prepared for Heaven. NOW YOU SHOULD BE WORRIED!

Perhaps we may say, no, I am not worried because I have taken steps to better prepare for the next life by allowing myself to use the gifts that God gives us freely. The gifts of love, faith, salvation and the gift we see talked about today, wisdom. Wisdom is of divine origin and it can be equaled to the grace and inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Divine Wisdom is indeed one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to us in the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is one of the gifts we can tap into at any time, all we must do is ask and pray from our hearts. As we see in our first reading: "Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her and found by those who seek her...whoever watches for her at dawn shall not be disappointed." And so, if we seek wisdom, listen to the Gospel and put its teachings into practice in our daily lives, if we receive the Sacraments, and love others as Jesus loved us, then we shall be like the wise virgins in today's Gospel who have plenty of oil (grace) to keep our lamps lit when Christ returns.

What if we say yes and no? There are times I am worried and times when I am not! Well, many of us can fall into this category in answering the question are you ready? If we are trying to do our

best to love as Jesus loved and to live out the teachings of the Gospel as well as we can, *then* that's a YES. However, sometimes I get too caught up with the fears and troubles of this world that I listen to the world's false wisdom. Sometimes I find myself doing what I do not want to do, and as a result I am unprepared for the life of Heaven. So how do we turn this either or, into a positive no, I am not worried? It is simple, trust in God, seek out His wisdom, and choose the life of the Resurrection. Never forget that preparing for the Kingdom of God is a personal responsibility. Think about the virgins who were unprepared, they could have been ready, but they procrastinated and when they realized that it was too late to get more oil, it was JUST TOO LATE! So the lesson that Jesus wants us to get is, do not put off working on what you have to do to be ready, for you do not know the time or the day when the Bridegroom will be returning. While preparing for the Kingdom is a personal responsibility, we can help each other get there, that is why Jesus founded His Holy Bride the Church. We are all in this together and we are to be always ready to help others become like the wise virgins.

## Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 33 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

October for some is their favorite month, and for some, it is the least favorite month! I say this because of the event we celebrate (or endure) at the end of this month; *Halloween!* Although this year it will be completely different. In today's world we know Halloween to mean the "Eve of All Hallows; The Eve of All Saints", and that is what we in the Church will celebrate on Oct. 31<sup>st</sup> and Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>. But we also know that we have many different customs that surround this day that would not be seen carried out in the Church.

Halloween goes back to the ancient Celtic Festival of *Sam Hain* (pronounced sow-in). The Celts lived in what is now, *Ireland, England, Wales, Scotland, and Northern France*. They celebrated their new year on November 1<sup>st</sup>, because this day marked the end of summer, with the harvest and it was the beginning of shorter days and colder weather. This time of year, 2021 years ago, was often associated with death as people succumbed to the harsh elements. They believed that on the night before the New Year, the boundary between the realm of the living and the dead was blurred. So, they celebrated Sam Hain on the 31<sup>st</sup>, and hoped that the ghost who came back would not cause trouble for the living and destroy crops as they believed they did. They also believed that the presence of these spirits helped their Druid Priests to tell the future. To celebrate the nights, they built huge bonfires where the people gathered to make grain and animal sacrifices. While performing these rituals, they wore costumes (made from animal heads and skins) and tried to tell each other's fortunes. When the celebration was over, they re-lit their own hearth fires, which they had put out in favor of the large bonfire.

When the Romans conquered a large part of their territory, about 43AD, they united their traditions with the Celtic ones. The Romans celebrated the Festival of *Feralia* (also in Oct.), and during this time they would remember the passing of the dead. The Romans honored their goddess *Pomona* (the goddess of fruit and trees and her symbol was an apple), and in her honor they would bob for apples. This was added to the Celtic Tradition quite quickly!

As European immigrants came to America, they brought their Halloween customs with them, but they were limited in their celebration in Puritan New England. In Maryland and the Southern Colonies, they were freer because other groups settled there, and they mixed their customs with those of the Native Americans that were there. They would tell ghost stories, tell each other's fortunes, but these celebrations were not always common. In the late 1800's there were moves made to make Halloween into a holiday more about community then about ghost, but this did not catch on. It was the years between the 1920's -1950's that saw a rise in Halloween like we know it today. They brought back the practice of trick or treat, and the providing of neighborhood children with treats, and they continued the wearing of costumes. It appears that the ancient customs of Europe did better here in America than in Europe where they make very little of Halloween (even though there have been attempts to make more of it).

So, there you have it! If you like Halloween, that is great? And if you do not, well there is always the next day of All Saints when we go to Mass to remember all the Saints that have gone on before us. And certainly, now we should be invoking the intercession of all the saints to help us get through these times

# Founder of the Knights of Columbus Beatified



Fr. Michael J. McGivney, a Roman Catholic Priest, was beatified on October 31, 2020. In his Apostolic Letter that was read at the Mass for Beatification Pope Francis stated that Blessed Michael McGivney's "zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and generous concern for the needs of his brothers and sisters made him an outstanding witness of Christian solidarity and fraternal assistance."

Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus at St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, CT in 1882 for three primary purposes. First, the Knights would serve as an antidote to those secret societies that lured Catholic men away from their faith by offering financial benefits. Second, the Order's insurance program would help keep Catholic families together when a breadwinner died; this would also help prevent a loss of faith among widows and orphans forced to live in state institutions or with non-Catholic relatives or adoptive families. Third, the Knights would champion the full rights of American citizenship for Catholics. This, too, would support the Church, since ensuring equal rights for Catholics would help limit the social or civil pressure on them to abandon their faith.

Father Michael J. McGivney was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. His example of charity, evangelization and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world. To learn more about Fr.
