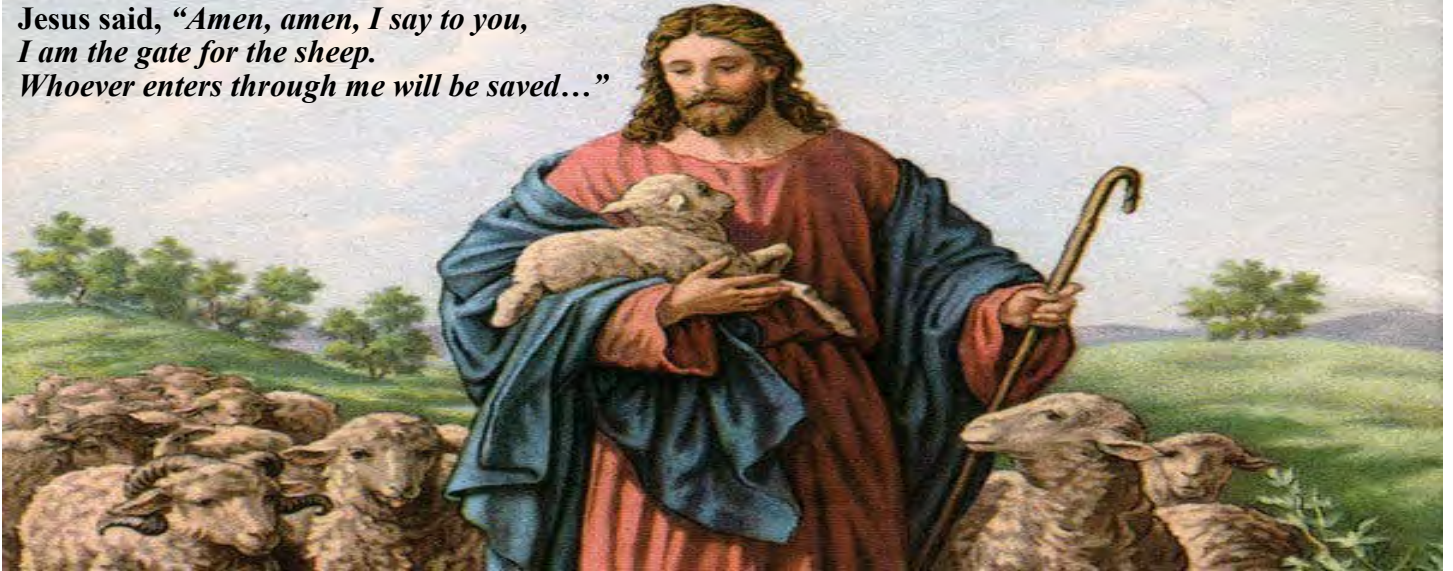

From Fr. Mike's Desk

“Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep...Whoever enter through Me will be saved...I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.”

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally called *Good Shepherd Sunday*, because the Gospel each year refers to Jesus as the Good Shepherd. This day reminds us that through the life, death and resurrection of Christ we have all become something new and that Jesus the Good Shepherd will lead all His sheep to salvation and eternal life; especially those sheep who are lost. Why does He refer to Himself as the Good Shepherd, and why does He refer to us as His sheep? It goes back to one of the images of God that is seen in the Old Testament, that God is Israel's shepherd. Keep in mind the relationship that a shepherd in the ancient world had with his sheep. The people of Israel believed that they had the same kind of relationship with God. Unlike modern shepherds who control their sheep with dogs, horses, and modern devices, shepherds in ancient Israel knew their sheep individually. They did not walk behind them, but before them so the shepherd could forge a path to ensure that they would not fall or get into any kind of trouble. The shepherd would search for the best pastureland and watering holes taking care of the sheep's every need. If a sheep were hurt, he would nurse it back to health and if one were lost he would go out and find it.

Jesus approaches us with the same care, and in today's Gospel, He refers to Himself as the Sheep Gate. Shepherds during Jesus' time, at night would act as a living gate standing or lying in front of the sheepfold, and he would make sure that every single sheep was accounted for. Likewise, Jesus as our living sheep gate knows each of us, watches over us and leads all people and every generation to the Father. Jesus also invites His disciples to do the same, to join Him in shepherding people. He is also calling us to serve as shepherd to each other and to help others get closer to God. The words of the ***Third Eucharistic Prayer*** repeat this as we read, *“...you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.”* These words tell us, that God the Father through the Son and by the working of the Holy Spirit is always calling us to Himself. He calls us to be His sheep but also His shepherds, and each of us is called to a specific

shepherding role in the Church. Jesus calls people to shepherd His sheep through the Ordained Ministries of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons. Jesus calls people to shepherd through the Consecrated Life of Religious Sisters and Brothers. These two groups of ministries call a person to dedicate their lives in service to the sheep watching over them and guiding them acting as Christ. On this day, we traditionally pray for an increase of vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate and Religious Life. Every Christian has an obligation to pray for vocations and everyone of us should be looking to encourage vocations among young men and women who they believe may have a calling to these ministries. Remember God is always calling people to these ministries; however, the problem is people do not know how to listen to God's voice. That is why it is our priority to echo the Divine calling. Its easy, all you have to do is ask! Ask that person have you ever thought of pursuing a religious vocation. Many of us in service to the Church in these ministries would not be here if we were not asked.

God bless you always and don't forget to ask.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 6 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to the Third Sunday of Easter, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

How are you doing? Are you keeping safe, and are you doing social distancing? These are familiar questions a lot of us are asking and or being asked since the Corona Virus made its appearance. In the beginning, I thought this would be over by the end of April, but now we know we must put up with this until May 15th. We also know that this date is not guaranteed but what else can we do? We must try to remain optimistic and perhaps we will be able to get back to some form of normalcy. Personally, I hope that we will be celebrating public Mass on May 17th or at least the following week, I hope I am right! As I have said before, I miss seeing you, and all of us being together. Of course, it may be a little different from what we are used to, but it will be nice to be together-even if it means we must wear masks and maintain social distance.

The Gospel this weekend tells us the account of the two disciples who take a journey to a small village just miles away from Jerusalem. They are on the Road to Emmaus, and they start out on their journey because they are extremely distraught. Distraught because Jesus did not live up to their expectations. They fervently believed in Him as He carried out the Public Ministry, as they heard Him preach and perform many miracles. Now they were faced with the reality of the Cross, and they did not know how to deal with it. In many ways we can be just like the two as we make this unwanted journey through Corona Virus Land. I hope that we will reach the end of this journey soon, however, who can say! As we started this journey, we were very upset, and certainly did not expect it to seem like it would be never ending. We have questioned everything and everyone including Our Lord.

We do not sell Jesus short, He is here as we pointed out last week, and as the Gospel for this weekend shows us. The two disciples on the road had different feelings after the stranger they were talking to, explained the teachings of the Law and the Prophets. That stranger expounded how everything pointed to how and why the Christ had to suffer everything to achieve our salvation. As we know they recognized Him when He was at table and broke the bread. With that their eyes were opened, and He vanished from their sight. Keep in mind, He did not vanish from the world or from their lives or ours. Christ is present with us, and He will be with us on every journey, especially the one we are on now. Do not give into despair and do not allow fear into your life. As Jesus tells us in John's Gospel, "Do not let your hearts be troubled...For I am the way and the truth and the life."

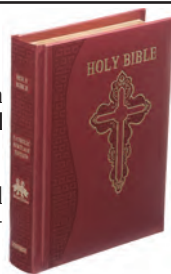
