From Fr. Mike's Desk

Who made us? *God made us.* **Who is God?** *God is the Supreme Being, infinitely perfect, who made all things and keeps them in existence.* **Why did God make us?** *God made us to show forth His goodness and to share with us His everlasting happiness in heaven.* **Is there only one God?** *Yes, there is only one God.* **How many persons are there in God?** *In God, there are three Divine Persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.*

Ok, enough of the *Baltimore Catechism* lesson, but for those of us who began our religious education with that Catechism it was a trip down memory lane. However, we should keep in mind, that the Catechism tells us a great deal of what we are celebrating today; God as God truly is! Granted we do this every day, but this Trinity Sunday reminds us in a special way the true nature of the One God in Three Divine Persons. Our God exists in the sense, as a community, and of course there is only one God, not three. While the Three Divine Persons are distinct from one another (in the fact that the Father is not the Son, the Son is not the Father, the Holy Spirit is not the Son, nor is The Spirit the Father, etc., etc.) they are still all the One God. All three persons are: powerful, all knowing, omnipresent, and perfectly equal to each other. (Right now, the computer I am writing this letter on is having a tough time figuring out what I am saying as the grammar check keeps coming on, but what do computers know?).

Why is this important to know, or at least have an idea about, as for most of us this is completely confusing. It is important because we must remember that we are made in the image and likeness of God, so the more we know about God, the more we get to know about ourselves! Now comes the question, how did we come to know about God existing in Three Divine Persons? Only through Jesus Christ! The people of the Old Testament did not know God in this way, it is only through the Divine Revelation given to us in the Words and Actions of Jesus that people began to understand that there was more to God than they ever knew! The Apostles and the early Church wondered how could Jesus die on the Cross, rise from the dead, and appear to us? The answer they received is only through the power of God. For when they saw the Risen Lord, they realized that He was more than one who was sent by God, but was indeed God Himself. They began to understand the words from John's Gospel when

Jesus told them that He and the Father were one. They began to understand the words that Jesus spoke to Mary Magdalene, on that first Easter Sunday, "I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." They could see that Jesus had a totally different relationship with God for He is God!

Along with this came the question, as how can Jesus be 100% God and 100% Human? How did God bring this about? This happens of course through the actions of the Holy Spirit that led us to greatly understand that there was more to God, that He does indeed exist in the community, trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Now, back to what was asked at the beginning of this letter. Why did God make us? Again, God made us to show forth His goodness and to share with us His Eternal Life and Love. God would not let anything interfere with this desire. Even when original sin entered the human family, He would not stop this goal from happening. Thus, the Father sent the Son to save us and restore us. When the Son's earthly mission was accomplished, He and the Father sent the Holy Spirit upon the Church so that we can constantly feel the presence of the Son, who continually leads us back to the Father. Now, which person of the Blessed Trinity is at work in achieving our Salvation? The answer is, of course, all Three! All of God is actively at work in our Salvation. God loves us so much, that He will not allow anything to prevent us from being saved.

and Holy Spirit!*

As with all of you, we look forward to additional restrictions being lifted, so until that time we are happy to continue streaming Sunday Mass from our church. Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 11 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to the Pentecost Sunday, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

Today, Sunday May 31st, is Pentecost Sunday and it is the last day of the Easter Season. On Monday June 1st, we return to Ordinary Time which hopefully is another sign of returning to a more normal world. The focus of Pentecost is of course the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and our Dear Blessed Mother. We call Pentecost the birthday of the Church, because the Holy Spirit empowered the Apostles to go forth and proclaim the Gospel without any fear or hesitation. As we read in Luke's Gospel, the Acts of the Apostles, and Matthew's Gospel Jesus told the Apostles to go out to all nations, but first they had to wait for the sending out of the Spirit. When the Holy Spirit came upon them, they went out into the streets of Jerusalem and told all gathered about the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus. Of course, the great miracle on that day was the fact that they were able to speak the many languages of all who were there. The Holy Spirit filled the Apostles with the necessary gifts and graces they needed. That same Holy Spirit has been given to the members of the Church for the past 2020 years, by the Apostles and their successors. As I always point out, today is also our birthday as we are all members of the living Body of Christ, the Church.

As we struggle through these difficult times, let us remember Jesus' words heard over the past few weeks. I will not leave you orphans, the Father will send another Advocate, and He will tell you all you need to know, and what to say. He will be a constant source of comfort as this Advocate is none other than God. Since March we have been living a different life, and so many of us have experienced events we thought we would never see. Yet, we survived, and we are making do, but I like you want to see this end. However, it probably will not be sometime soon. We have some hope, Long Island was able to enter Phase 1, as some more businesses have been able to reopen. We can now offer Funeral Masses, but this is restricted to 10 people, wearing masks, and practicing social distancing. It is not great, but it is a start. When Phase 2 begins more things will reopen and hopefully that will mean, we will be able to have weekday Masses again and following that Sunday Masses. Please keep in mind that even when we can celebrate Masses on Sunday, it will be with some restrictions, as to how many people can gather in the Church. To solve this problem, we will also be celebrating Mass in the Gym, this should allow the whole congregation to gather. We will still be filming Mass for those who are homebound or are afraid to come out. This will be the new normal for some time, but we will get through it because the Holy Spirit will give us the gifts and graces, we need to get through it all. And I know that we all have the strength and determination to succeed.

We end with this prayer for Pentecost: Father of light, from whom every good gift comes, send your Spirit into our lives with the power of a mighty wind, and by the flame of your wisdom open the horizons of our minds. Loosen our tongues to sing your praise in words beyond the power of speech, for without your Spirit we could never raise our voices in words of peace, or courage. Help us to announce the truth that Jesus is Lord and is stronger than anything the world throws at us. For He lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

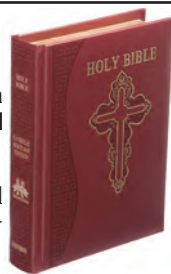
