

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today and for the next few weekends we will be having class with Jesus the Divine Teacher, so pay attention and don't forget your apple (but not Adam and Eve's apple). Jesus teaches us with parables and He does so to fulfill what was said by the Prophet Isaiah, "...so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; my word shall not return void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it." Perhaps there have been times when you ask, like the Apostles, why can't Jesus speak plainly, why does He have to speak in parables? Well the answer is linked to what God intends for His word, or better yet, who God intends to act upon His word. For anyone who has ears should listen and realize that the parables are more than just interesting stories or good analogies. Yes, in a way they are stories, and God knows that we love stories, and that we find them easier to remember and, of course, pass them on. We certainly remember them better than a standard lesson at school or at work. Stories also have a point to deliver and they can guide us to a certain way of thinking, and Jesus' Parables are no different. However, they are different because they just do not deal with things of this world, but with the mysteries of faith, the Kingdom of God, and how we respond to them. God does not intend for His mysteries to be explained in prose that could render them commonplace and even be ignored, nor does He want them in language that is so esoteric that they are too hard to understand. No, He uses parables to invite us to see God/Jesus in our daily lives, as in the story of *The Sowing of* the Seed

Sadly, not everyone can get the point of seeing the mystery that the parable is leading us to. They are not capable of applying the meaning to their lives and sometimes they cannot get past their own blindness (like the Temple officials when Jesus healed the man born blind). But there is hope for those who cannot see, because God tries not to leave people totally in the dark. He constantly communicates to them through the grace and power of the Holy Spirit; all one needs to do is listen! This is seen when Jesus explained the Parable of the Sower, we can understand it if we listen

In fact, each time I read or listen to the parable, I believe that depending on the situation or where I am in my life at that particular time, I can fit into each of the categories Jesus mentions when it

comes to where the seed falls. This may apply to you as well. Hopefully, for most of my life I am like the seed sown on the rich soil; I hear the Word of God, I try to understand it, and do my best to allow it to take rest in my heart and soul. However, I know that there are times when I feel or act like the seed that was sown on rocky soil. Yes, I do hear the Word, I accept it with joy, but then temptation enters my life and I give in to sin. Of course, I dislike it when I am on rocky soil, but I do know that due to human weakness I can often feel like this, in fact we all can! Nonetheless, with the help of God and the prayers of our brothers and sisters, we can hope that the times we are among the rocks will not last long and not occur too frequently. And we should all hope that we never become like the seed that was sown on the path, which makes us a person who refuses to understand the Word of God and allows the evil one to take us totally away.

We close with the opening prayer from today's Mass:

O God, who shows the light of Your truth to those who go astray, so that they may return to the right path, give all who for the faith they profess, are accounted Christians the grace to reject whatever is contrary to the name of Christ and to strive after all that does it honor. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 15 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

This weekend we celebrate the greatest day on our nation's calendar, Independence Day: aka the 4th of July. Many years ago, when I was a student at Adelphi University, my history professor asked the following question about the American Revolution. He asked was it truly a revolution, or was it more of a rebellion? According to King George III the Colonies were in rebellion and he was going to put a stop to it. Yet, many here regarded the actions taken as revolutionary, in the idea that things were really going to change. We certainly saw this with the French Revolution, which began years later but also during the month of July. We saw France go from an absolute monarchy to a republic, and the revolutionary leaders went out to destroy all elements of the old kingdom.

However, this did not totally happen here, and that is what brought about the professor's question. In many ways the colonist's actions resulted in a rebellion because after the war, the same people who ran the colonies, were now running the country. Yes, England was no longer calling the shots, and the King and Parliament would eventually be replaced by a President and Congress. But the British system of government was for the most part intact, with only a few changes. So, in this sense it was a rebellion. But Americans call it a revolution, why? I believe that while it was a rebellion, it was also a revolution in ways that still matter today. Until America rebelled, no European colony ever broke away from its mother country, and no group of people demanded that they had created a new culture, a new nation with new ways of doing things and with a new mentality. It was a revolution because the government they eventually created contained the notion of having three separate but equal branches of government, with a system of checks and balances. It provided for the government to change and grow as the nation changed, and it did this by allowing amendments to be added. In fact, before it was even given to the states for a vote 10 changes were made to which guaranteed people's rights over the government, we call this The Bill of Rights. Chief among these rights is the Freedom of Speech, the Press, Worship, the Right to Assembly, and the Right to Petition the Government.

The American Revolution did achieve much for our Founding Fathers and Mothers, and for all who came here from all over the world. But as we have seen in recent years and in the past few months, it is not perfect, and we still have a great deal of work to do, to be a more perfect nation. The Framers of the Constitution knew this and expected us to keep working, so that we can follow the word's of President Abraham Lincoln spoken at Gettysburg "...that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

This revolutionary spirit and this dedication to make things better has always gotten us through and is helping us now as we go through the effects of the Corona Virus. We are not there yet, but with all of us working together, and with the help of Almighty God, we will succeed.

Happy Fourth of July and may God bless you always!



Registration Info for the 2020-2021 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

Due to the COVID Pandemic, classes in the fall will begin in October with weekly online Google Meet classes. We are planning, however, to resume "in school" weekly classes after the Christmas Break. This will give us the time to "open up" safely.

Pantry Hours: 9:30-12:00 noon Monday-Thursday and 2nd Saturday of the month

Our food pantry continues to be is open and serving the community. The items we could use in the coming weeks are: personal hygiene products, cleaning supplies, such as laundry detergent, shampoo, mouthwash and toothpaste. All of these items cannot be purchased with SNAP benefits (food stamps) and often are expensive. If you are able to donate any of these items, please leave them in the vestibule of the church. We are not taking any donations of clothes or books, please don't leave them in the church or in front of the SVdP bins.

Since the pandemic began we have seen the number of household visits per month double. Before the pandemic, we were providing food for an average of 100 household visits per month to currently 200 household visits. There are more families with children who have been coming to the pantry. We invite the families to visit the pantry every two weeks, with exceptions for families with a large number of children who we invite to come weekly.

Most of the families coming to us have not been working and are not receiving any public assistance. A few of the families have been able to return to work, however, we are still providing food and basic items of daily living to those families who are not working or receiving any public assistance. They have been grateful to all of you for helping them during this trying time.

Life is not always easy and light. It is full of trials and tests, especially adjusting to life during this pandemic. There are issues and concerns within every family that have caused fears, uncertainties and anxieties.

But life is not that hard after all when we trust in God and rest in Him, for only in the Lord can we truly find rest. Amidst suffering and pain, we follow the Lord and take the yoke and learn from Him. Our lives will be light and easy because we keep his Word and live by it. When we follow the Lord, life will be lighter as God lives in us.

Thank you for helping us to help those in need, especially during this pandemic.


