

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's Gospel, as I have said many times before, is a most difficult Gospel to preach on. In fact, it is even difficult to read. It shows us a Jesus no one wants to see. It shows us a Jesus that is completely opposite from the Jesus we usually see. Jesus is mean to this woman, and makes her jump through hoops to seek a cure for her daughter. This is certainly true after a quick surface reading, however, if we study it closely, we can see much is at work here, and Jesus is not as mean as He appears.

Many of the biblical commentators, point out that this reading is a foreshadowing of the Church reaching out to non-Jews, and looking at some of the problems that this may present. At first many believe that Matthew's disciples were reluctant to embrace gentile converts, but that idea changed as they better understood Jesus' universal call. We see this reluctance as we read Matthew's account and how the Apostles wanted Jesus to give her what she wants so she will go away. At first it looks like Jesus does not know what to do, as the Apostles did not care about this woman, they just wanted her to go. However, Jesus is truly moved with compassion for this woman and her daughter. But if He gave into her request as she is a gentile, and to top it off a Canaanite (the ancient enemies of the Jews), He would lose all credibility among the Jews. This would be evidence to use against Him by those who would denounce Him. At least that is how it seems on the surface. Jesus comes back at the woman's call by stating that He came for the lost sheep of Israel, but she persisted and said "Lord, help me." Jesus' reply was certainly surprising when He tells her; "It is not right to take the food of children and throw it to the dogs." How can the Son of God refer to a person as a dog? Yet it was common in Jesus' day for the Jews to refer to non-Jews as dogs. While this is bad enough, by today's standards, the word used commonly was that of defining a street dog. A dog that was savage and a scavenger (a word that later would be used to refer to Christians). Again, why would Jesus use this expression? Well the truth is Jesus used another word for dog when He addressed her. Jesus used the word which denotes a pet or a beloved dog. In fact, in older translations the words pet dog are written. This is a different matter; Jesus is truly looking at her with compassion. While the others may not have picked up on the use of the word, the woman did, which is why she was bold enough to reply to

Jesus, "Please Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." She made the connection with Jesus and understood how His approach was different from the crowd and even His disciples.

This account also tells us other reasons why Jesus came to her aid. He answers her request because of her great faith and her great love. She is a model for us to follow as she believed that He had the power to cast out the demon which is why she addresses Him as Lord. She was persistence in her faith and in her prayer that she would not allow even Jesus to stand in her way. How often in our prayers do we get weary, or think that God is not listening to us? We must be like this woman and not allow anything to stop us. The other reason why she is a model for us, is her capacity to love. She loved her daughter so much, that she would continue crying out until Jesus stopped. God who is love, responded in kind and rewarded her love for her child as He showed His love for her. Compassion, love, prayer and faith all come together in this Gospel message. Let us have the ears to hear, the eyes to see and to realize that God is always at work in our world and in our lives.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 21 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

As if the Corona Virus was not enough, this week Mother Nature hit us again with Tropical Storm Isaias. It might make some people ask, what did we do to deserve this? Well of course the answer to this question is, we did nothing wrong and God is not punishing us for anything we might have done wrong. The storm is nature following what the natural world dishes out to us. The natural world has its own laws and protocols to follow and we must do our best to try and understand them, and likewise respect them. Keep in mind, that God has given us a great deal of knowledge about the world. Think about it, we know so much more than we knew 100 or even 50 years ago. However, COVID 19 shows us that we still need to know more. In due time we will know more, but right now we know more than we did five months ago. As mentioned in this space many times, God is guiding us on the road to a vaccine and hopefully better treatments. Hopefully, a year from now, we will have a greater understanding of the virus, a vaccine, and less fear. However, a year is 365 days away, and so much can happen in a year, both good and bad. So, what do we do? Do not lose faith in God, or in the people who are working hard to develop a vaccine, and better treatments. Do not lose faith in those who are taking care of the sick in the hospitals and nursing homes, and at their own homes. All of us must work together and pray together, it does make a difference.

The name Isaias is Spanish for Isaiah. The Prophet Isaiah is one of the major prophets of the Old Testament, and during the time of his prophecy, the people were told that Jerusalem would be conquered, and the people would be taken into exile. Later, he would tell the people that their time of exile would end, and that God would return them to their old life. In fact, God promised that they will have a better life, and they are told that God will send a Messiah. The Messiah whose life and message would free them and all the people of the world. Isaiah also warns the people, as time went on, that they were not following the Lord's commands, and they were not leading better, holier lives and were not doing their part to prepare the world for the coming of Christ. Unfortunately, the people refused to hear, and as a result they fell into their old ways and trusted only in human beings and not God. As time went on, they were conquered by the Greeks and the Greeks were conquered by the Romans, who in 72 AD destroyed the Temple. However, things were different in 72 AD. The Messiah had come, the Pascal Mystery was carried out (and is still being carried out) and the Holy Spirit came upon the Church. All things were new, for Jesus had changed the world and us.

Again, as we go through this difficult time, never forget that things are different because of Christ. Even though we have lost people whom we love, remember they followed in the footsteps of Christ and all the Saints. While we miss them, we know that they are still with us as they are members of the Communion of Saints. Also, they are in a better place and one day we will be with them again.


