# Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Reading 1 - Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

In the year King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above.

They cried one to the other, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke.

Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar.

He touched my mouth with it, and said, "See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" "Here I am," I said; "send me!"

#### Reading 2 - 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

I am reminding you, brothers and sisters, of the gospel I preached to you, which you indeed received and in which you also stand. Through it you are also being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you, unless you believed

in vain. For I handed on to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. After that, Christ appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God that is with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

#### Gospel - Luke 5:1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

# From Fr. Mike's Desk

Each year as we begin Ordinary Time, we read an account about the call of the first disciples. This usually takes place rather early in Ordinary Time, on or about the second and/or the third week. Yet in this current cycle from the Gospel of Luke, we read on the second week, the story of the Wedding Feast and Miracle at Cana. This comes from John's Gospel, and it states at its ending, that Jesus changed the water into wine so that His disciples would have a greater belief in Him. So according to this story, Jesus had already called His disciples, how is this the case? Remember in John's Gospel the first disciples were originally disciples of John the Baptist, and it is John who points Jesus out to them. It is John who tells them that this is the one whom I spoke to you about, and now you are to follow Him.

This is not the case with the Synoptic Gospels. They have the similar account of Jesus calling the disciples at the Sea of Galilee. Luke like Matthew and Mark tell us that their call was accompanied by a great catch of fish, greater than anyone ever saw before. Yet, before we get to the seashore, Luke takes us on a trip to Nazareth where Jesus reads from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. He read the passage that could only be fulfilled by the Messiah, and He announced that today in your hearing this prophecy is fulfilled. Luke does indeed have Jesus take the long road to the sea, but on His way there He teaches, heals the sick, cast out demons, and continues to gain many followers. In fact, we are told that the crowd was so large that Jesus asked Peter to use his boat so He could go out a little on the sea for all to hear Him. Peter and the crew agree, but they are very tired because they were fishing all night and caught nothing. They, like most people in Galilee, heard everything about Jesus, so they most likely wanted to listen to what He had to say, so they went along with His request, until He told them to go out into the sea and cast the nets for a catch. protests that they were out all night and they caught nothing, why should they try now? they agree, and as you know they came in with the biggest catch ever.

With this, Peter realizes that he is in the presence of holiness, and he has just seen the power of God at work. So now being very much afraid, he begs Jesus to depart from him for he is a sinful man. Jesus tells them not to be afraid, for from now on they will be catching men. Jesus

calms their fears, and some how they know deep in their hearts and souls they are in the presence of a deeply holy man who could be the Messiah! So, they leave everything behind and follow Him. We will read later how Jesus calls the others to follow Him, for example, there is the call of Matthew (or in Luke's Gospel Levi), how Jesus passes him, and tells him to follow Him, and so he does, leaving his tax position empty, and follows the Messiah.

Now it comes to us, we like the first disciples have been called to catch people, to follow Jesus, to open our hearts and souls to Him and to share the faith with others. While we may not have witnessed a great catch of fish, or water turned into wine, we have experienced something far greater. We have the Holy Spirit, and it is God the Holy Spirit who has made Christ known to us. We are not to be afraid as we see in today's reading from Isaiah. How frightened He was, as He stands in the Celestial Court of Heaven, until a Seraphim touches His lips with an ember from the altar. As we continue reading, God asks who shall I send to spread the Word, Isaiah said, "Here I am Lord", send me! We, too, have had our lips touched by the power of God, and we too can say to God, here I am, send me. If you have not realized that, now is the time.


