#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week, this week, and next week, Matthew's Gospel goes through a whole series of parables. In these parables, Jesus is speaking about serving God and the Kingdom of Heaven. In the parables for these next two weekends we focus on what the Kingdom is like. Remember Jesus speaks in parables so that His teaching comparisons would be revealed. He also uses them so that only those who understand can glean the teaching. Of course, those who do not understand may never get it. Jesus says, "I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has been from the foundation of the world." What is required to fully understand the parables, is wisdom. This is not referring to earthly wisdom, but the wisdom that is God's.

If you look at the Old Testament readings for these two weeks they speak directly about Divine Wisdom. Our reading for the 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday is from the Book of Wisdom. It speaks about no other god besides our God cares for His people, and no other god teaches His children by His deeds that we must be just, kind, and people of hope. allows for a better life and the repentance of sins. This wisdom draws us closer to God, as we see His love for us. The Old Testament reading for the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday comes from the *First Book of* **Kings**. In this reading, the Lord appears to a young Solomon in a dream. As we are told, God offers the young king a wish. As God tells him, "Ask something of me and I will give it to you." God is willing to give Solomon anything he wants. Imagine God saying that to you. What would you ask of God? Would it be long life, riches, power or anything else you can think of? Solomon answers God, with the statement few would have said. "O Lord, my God, you have made me, your servant, king to succeed my father David, but I am a mere youth...Give your servant, therefore, an understanding heart to judge your people..." We are told that God was very pleased with his answer and God tells Solomon, "I will do as you I give you a heart so wise and requested. understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you will come one to equal you." Solomon is asking God for the gift of wisdom, the gift to act rightly, and to judge people fairly. He knows that this will be the only way he can serve God, by serving the people of Without this wisdom, Israel as their king. Solomon would not have the good reputation, and the Kingdom of Israel would not have grown as it did.

This gift of wisdom, in fact the gifts of wisdom are necessary if anyone is to move forward in their relationship with God. Wisdom is an attribute of the Holy Spirit and it is the Spirit who spoke through the Prophets, inspired the Scriptures, and most importantly came upon the Apostles and our dear Blessed Mother at Pentecost. It is the Holy Spirit and His gifts which empowers the Church and her Sacraments.

Again, it is with the heavenly wisdom that we can begin to understand Jesus' parables. Our Lord goes to great lengths to tell us what the Kingdom of God is like. By making comparisons with earthly realities and situations it is hoped that the Divine Wisdom will help us understand. In most of the comparisons Jesus gives us, we can see that the Kingdom comes upon us by surprise. As we see for the 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday, The Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed. It is the smallest of all the seeds, yet when fully grown it the largest of plants. It becomes so large that birds of the sky can build their nests in it. Something so small, yet when it grows it is much larger. Jesus uses the same illustration when He compares the Kingdom like flour mixed with yeast. How, when mixed, in the proper proportions the yeast, the flour and water make a larger pile of dough that can make so many loaves. The Kingdom is something that grows, and the more we invoke wisdom the more we can see it grow and participate in it.

#### Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 17 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

During the lockdown our students, teachers and parents experienced virtual learning via zoom or some other medium. When I asked several parents how the experience was, I got mixed reviews. Some parents thought it was ok, while others did not like it at all. Many parents who likewise were under lockdown rules, had to help their children do their schoolwork while at the same time were working from home. They found this at times very hard to balance. I am told that the students in the upper grades had less problems, while those in the lower grades found it more of a challenge. Several teachers found it incredibly difficult to teach their classes while at the same time helping their own children with their work.

I certainly think that having the internet available for such a good purpose was a blessing, and I am grateful for the gift it provided our students and teachers, but I do not believe that this is the best method for teaching or learning. Today I read in the paper, that the Governor will decide in early August as to how and when the schools will open in September. We will see!

This Sunday's Gospel introduces us to a whole series of Parables delivered by Jesus. As we will see, Jesus used these stories and analogies as a very effective teaching method to spread and explain the Gospel. Our Lord is one of the best story tellers the world has ever seen. His stories can stay with you forever, as they become deeply rooted in our hearts. And while we can find Jesus' stories on the internet, they still mean more when we hear them read or we read them in the Scriptures. Who does not like a good story? It is human nature for us to sit and listen to them, whether we are around the campfire or at the feet of the storyteller. As we read or listen to the whole series of parables, put your self at Jesus' feet, relax, open your heart and let Him in. Jesus' words are so peaceful, so healing, and comforting. They tell us that He is here to help us get through anything, even and especially what we are going through now!

# PARISH OUTREACH EFFORT UPDATE

Over the last couple of months, telephone calls have been made to all parishioners. A small group of volunteers reached out, at the request of Fr. Mike, in an attempt to check in with our parishioners to make sure everyone was well and safe, and if any needs were identified they were addressed and resolved.

Please be aware that everyone that is registered in our parish was called.

We did encounter a few problems of not being able to connect with everyone:

- 1) <u>Disconnected phone numbers</u> many people have disconnected land lines, but haven't brought their parish registration information up to date with an alternate contact number or cell number.
- 2) A handful of numbers required an 'access code' in order to get through.
- No answer/kept ringing any number of reasons: no one home, people working from home during the pandemic and could not be interrupted, or many do not answer a number that is not recognized.
- 4) <u>Answering machine was full</u> MANY messages were left, but a few numbers indicated the machine was full and it was not possible to leave a message.

There were approximately 2,800 calls made, and every effort was made to identify persons living alone to make sure they had someone checking on them to be sure they are safe and well. If you know of anyone that lives alone or has a need, please let us know. These are whom Fr. Mike is most concerned about and looks to all of us to reach out and let him know who they are.

On behalf of Fr. Mike, I would like to thank all the people that helped with this monumental task: Diego Laserna, Janet Hofgren, Elizabeth Kempton, Jayne McPartland, Jean Peters, and Mary Wood. You all did a phenomenal job...thank you!



# Registration Info for the 2020-2021 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

Due to the COVID Pandemic, classes in the fall will begin in October with weekly online Google Meet classes. We are planning, however, to resume "in school" weekly classes after the Christmas Break. This will give us the time to "open up" safely.
