

From Fr. Mike's Desk

We now continue where we left off from last week's letter.

In the Gospel for the 17th Sunday we are told that the Kingdom comes upon us like a pleasant surprise. It is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again. He then goes out and sells all he owns to buy the field and possess the great treasure. Jesus also compares the Kingdom as a pearl of great price. When one finds it, one goes out and sells everything to have it. The pearl, and the treasure were come upon by surprise, and using earthly wisdom we can see why a person would sell everything to have this field and its treasure and to have the pearl. If we use heavenly wisdom, we too must do whatever we can to obtain the Kingdom of Heaven. There is nothing like God's Kingdom; it is what we hope for and pray for every day. It is there where we will find our true happiness, it is where we will be with God and our loved ones forever

Surprise is good, but the Parables also show us a warning. Jesus warns us that the forces of evil, human, and supernatural, want to take the joys of the Kingdom away from all who have found it or are still looking for it. We see this in the Parable of the Weeds and the Wheat. As we listen to the Parable, we are told, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everyone was asleep his enemy came and sowed weeds all through the wheat... When the crop grew and bore fruit, the weeds appeared as well." After the farmer acknowledged that an enemy had done this, he told his workers not to pull out the weeds, as the wheat will also be pulled out and all will be lost. He then told his workers. "Let them grow together until harvest; then at the harvest time, I will say to the harvesters; 'First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into When Jesus explained this my barn.'" parable, He pointed out that the enemy is the devil and the farmer who sowed the good seed is the Son of Man (Jesus). The field is the

world and the good seed, hopefully, is us. The weeds are the children of the evil one who will do anything to cut us off from the Kingdom of Heaven.

While the forces of evil would like us to stay out of the Kingdom, we should keep in mind that the evil can also be the temptations of this world, as well as the individual weaknesses we all have and constantly fight against. We must be on guard against these forces as the wicked snares of the devil.

With God's help we will be able to do this and with this help we will not be the one who is thrown out or into the fiery furnace where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. With His help we will be one who shines like the sun in the Kingdom of Our Father. "Whoever has ears, ought to hear."

Let us finish with the words Our Savior taught us. Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 18 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote. The letter is reprinted here for those of you who do not have internet access.

Some time ago, I asked you how you were doing dealing with this crisis. We have gone through quite a lot since this whole thing started in mid-March, and in the beginning, it seemed like it would never end. Now we are seeing some light at the end of the tunnel. Of course, when we see reports from the other parts of the country, we think that the tunnel has gotten longer and the light dimmer. Certainly, there is no easy way out of this pandemic, and it probably be with us for a longer time then we want it too (that time I think has already passed).

But things are not as bad as they were in March, there are better treatments and the medical and drug professionals have a better handle on how to treat this virus, however, we must remember that while the death rate is going down in our area, people are still dying or have difficulties recovering from Corona. We have entered Phase 4 and life is a lot better than it was during the lockdown, but we are not back to normal yet. However, currently we can relax a little, and enjoy some parts of our past lives, while still practicing precautions of wearing masks and distancing.

Yet, at times I find this situation to be like a double-edged sword. Yes, I am happy for what we have gained back, but I also find myself preoccupied. I find myself not in a state of melancholy, but at times I find myself in deep thought and it is not pleasant thought. It possibly could be that we are now given time to decompress. But this is not easy to do when we read the news and we still must follow all these restrictions and practices. It is like going through an emergency and you need to be the one keeping your wits about you so the emergency will not get worse. But when it is over, you start coming down from the high energy you had to summon, and you basically fall apart. In my conversations with people I find that I am not alone, and I am sure that many more people are feeling the same way. It is OK, it is part of how we survive in tight situations, and we must not be afraid. Acknowledge your feelings, but do not let them totally control or paralyze you. We really are in this together, and the one good thing that has come out of this crisis is, we have all pitched in to help one another. We have done our part in helping our neighbor (and if we have not done so yet, there is still time).

In this Sunday's Mass, God offers the young King Solomon anything he wants. He could choose from riches, power, or any worldly treasure. However, Solomon does not ask for any of these things. Rather he asks God for an understanding heart, a heart that is filled with wisdom. God is so impressed with this, that God tells the young king that no one will ever be as wise as he, except of course Our Lord Jesus Christ. If we like Solomon ask for God's wisdom and love, we will be able to withstand anything, we will be able to get passed the Corona Virus, the restrictions that it has caused, and all of the other effects imposed on us.

Never lose hope or faith and never allow the built-up stress to get the better of you. Remember what it says on our currency and our coins, "In God we Trust".



PARISH OUTREACH EFFORT UPDATE

Over the last couple of months, telephone calls have been made to all parishioners. A small group of volunteers reached out, at the request of Fr. Mike, in an attempt to check in with our parishioners to make sure everyone was well and safe, and if any needs were identified they were addressed and resolved.

Please be aware that everyone that is registered in our parish was called.

We did encounter a few problems of not being able to connect with everyone:

- 1) <u>Disconnected phone numbers</u> many people have disconnected land lines, but haven't brought their parish registration information up to date with an alternate contact number or cell number.
- 2) A handful of numbers required an 'access code' in order to get through.
- 3) <u>No answer/kept ringing</u> any number of reasons: no one home, people working from home during the pandemic and could not be interrupted, or many do not answer a number that is not recognized.
- 4) <u>Answering machine was full</u> MANY messages were left, but a few numbers indicated the machine was full and it was not possible to leave a message.

There were approximately 2,800 calls made, and every effort was made to identify persons living alone to make sure they had someone checking on them to be sure they are safe and well. If you know of anyone that lives alone or has a need, please let us know. These are whom Fr. Mike is most concerned about and looks to all of us to reach out and let him know who they are.

On behalf of Fr. Mike, I would like to thank all the people that helped with this monumental task: Diego Laserna, Janet Hofgren, Elizabeth Kempton, Jayne McPartland, Jean Peters, and Mary Wood. You all did a phenomenal job...thank you!



Registration Info for the 2020-2021 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in students' religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

Due to the COVID Pandemic, classes in the fall will begin in October with weekly online Google Meet classes. We are planning, however, to resume "in school" weekly classes after the Christmas Break. This will give us the time to "open up" safely.
