From Fr. Mike's Desk

We have now come to the last non-official weekend of summer, Labor Day Weekend. No one can deny that we have gone through a totally different spring and summer. We have experienced events that none of us ever thought we would. We also know that as we start this September everything is going to be a little different, especially with the kids returning to school.

These changes are difficult to adjust to, but as stated before, we will get through this together with the help of God. Monday is Labor Day, a day we look forward to by having parties, bar-b-q's and buying back-to-school clothes and supplies. However, let us focus on this day to remember and be thankful for all the labors of those who build our great nation and a better world. All the labors, great and small that keep us going. We salute and pray for every worker, and bless the fruits of their labors that help them support themselves, their families, and all of society. Unfortunately, we know that due to the lockdown and the continued concerns generated by the Corona Virus, many people have lost their jobs or are underemployed, or are working below their total capacity. Let us continue to pray for them and ask God to help them get back to work soon. For some of us, these conditions can lead to new opportunities and careers, let us hope they continue to do well. Keep in mind that no matter what kind of labor we are engaged in, if it is honest and builds up the human condition, it is blessed and pleasing to God. And we must never forget all of the hard labors of those in the medical field, first responders, fire and police, those who worked in vital industries and in the stores, those who keep the hospitals clean and supplied, those who worked in food pantries, teaching our students, and so many more positions during the lockdown and the time after. We thank you all and you are in our prayers.

Our reading for today also speaks about labor. We saw in the reading from Ezekiel, how God appointed him watchman over the House of Israel. The watchman was appointed to warn the people of approaching trouble, especially in time of war. Ezekiel in this passage is being told by God that he is to watch over the people and point out the wrong they are doing. It is his job to warn them that their souls are in danger if they do not repent. If he is successful, they will be saved, if not, they

will not. However, if he fails to warn them, he too will suffer and die. God is telling him that he must go out of his way to save the people. If he does, he will not be held accountable for those who do not listen. This same job is given to all of us in today's Gospel. Jesus is telling the disciples (and us) how we should act when a brother sins against us. He tells them to speak to the person one on one, in hopes of solving the problem. If that does not work, we are to take two others with us to be witnesses and offer their opinions. If that does not work, go to the Church and let the community decide. Hopefully, that will work, but as Jesus points out, if one does not listen to the Church one is not listening to Him. As He tells us, "For when two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." However, we must all be totally gathered in Jesus' name, not just merely appearing to be. If that does not work, then the person is to be treated as an outsider, until he or she has a change of heart. This is not the finish that Jesus is looking for. The job of the Christ is to bring all people together in His name, and for us to work to build the Kingdom of God. The way we do this is seen in St. Paul's Letter for today. Paul tells us the Love of one's neighbor is how we fulfill Commandments and the Beatitudes, and how we can change those who do not love or know how to love. As he writes, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself! Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence love is the fulfillment of the law."

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 24 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

On Thursday August 27th and on Friday August 28th, we celebrate the Feast Days of St. Monica and her son Saint Augustine. These are two very important saints from the early Church, and they still have a great effect on us today. You may know the story of these two saints, and maybe you do not, either way it is good for us to quickly go over their backgrounds and their activities.

St. Monica was born a Christian in 331AD in the North African city of Tagaste. She was married to Patricius a Roman who was a pagan, and she lived with him and his mother who at times were very abusive. Yet, he honored his wife and her beliefs, so she could freely practice her faith. During her life she prayed constantly for the conversion of her children, especially her oldest child Augustine. He studied Rhetoric and at the age of 17 he left for Italy. He did not tell her he was going away, and when she found out she was very hurt and upset. But this determined mother left for Rome herself and later to Milan where she found him. Augustine was an extremely intelligent young man, who had listened to all types of philosophies and religious beliefs. He never could decide which to follow and was always unsettled looking for the truth. While he never hated Christianity, he never fully embraced it either. His mother would constantly ask him, when was he going to be baptized, and he kept putting her off. She tried every method to get him to convert, and when all else failed she used guilt. How could she be happy in this life or in heaven if his soul were not saved?

Augustine not only dabbled in all types of beliefs, he also participated in many vices, we know this from his own writings. He would explain how he was led astray and how all these actions did not give life but took away from true life and life in the spirit. One of their great friends in Milan, and Monica's Spiritual Director, was a man called Ambrose. Ambrose was the Governor of the province which was headquartered in Milan. When the Bishop of the area passed away, he was proclaimed Bishop because of his holiness, honesty and great ability to administer the area. St. Ambrose was likewise a very important Saint of that period and was named one of the first Doctors of the Church. After speaking with Ambrose and staying with him for some time, Augustine began to see the light, and the power of the Holy Spirit came upon him. Augustine not only became a Christian, he was consumed by Christ every second of every minute, of every hour of every day! He was Baptized at 33, ordained a priest at 36, and became a Bishop at 41. He wrote many books about the teachings of the Church, and we still rely on them today. He was made a Saint, declared a Doctor of the Church, and is the Patron Saint of Theologians.

Shortly after his conversion, St. Monica died, she told her son, she had no reason for staying here and wanted to be with Jesus. All she wanted to see in this life was granted with his conversion. She died in 387AD at the age of 57. St. Augustine as Bishop and Doctor proclaimed the Good News everywhere and was like one of the Great Prophets of the Old Testament, he spoke even when others did not want him to speak. He died at the age of 76 in 430AD.

St. Monica was persistent and would not stop until all in her family followed Christ, she serves as a great model for parents to follow as they help their children grow into a true relationship with God. She is a patron saint for mothers, and she is ready to assist all mothers with her prayers. St. Augustine reminds us that anybody can change and turn their lives around to follow Jesus. As we travel during this time of uncertainty, fear, and for some many sorrows, we must not lose sight of God helping us and providing us Saints as examples of faith along the journey. We must remember that no time in the Church's history or for that fact in the world's history has been without struggles. No time has been without disease, poverty or unrest, but in every time, God has been present to give us strength and blessings.

With this in mind we ask Saint Monica, Saint Augustine, Saint Edward the Confessor, Saint Agnes, and of course Our Dear Blessed Mother to pray for us so we can be over this time of trouble sooner than later.

Registration Info for the 2020-2021 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation curriculum for public school children in the parish. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and continue their religious formation through grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion later in May of that year. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in

grades 7 and 8with the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of grade 9.

Due to the COVID Pandemic, RE classes in the fall will begin the first week in October with weekly online Google Meet grade level sessions. We are hoping to resume "in school" weekly classes after the Christmas Break. This will give us the time necessary to "open up" safely.


