#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's Gospel reading tells us the familiar story of the vineyard owner and the people he hires to harvest his grapes. In the past I have pointed out the great generosity of the owner, who of course in Jesus' story is God the Father. I have also asked if we can be as generous as God. But the question has been asked as to what causes Jesus to offer this parable in the first place?

We see the reason behind it in Matthew Chapter 19. In this passage, Peter asks Jesus what is the Apostles' reward for following Him. They gave up everything of human value to be His followers, and so what will they receive? Why does Peter ask such a question? Well, in Jesus' time, many who acted as religious or military leaders would promise their followers many things including a share in their victory, only to back out in the end, and take everything for themselves. Certainly, Peter did not want this to happen to Therefore, Jesus does not get angry at Peter, rather he offers this story. Jesus in this parable shows them that the Kingdom of God is completely different from any earthly kingdom, especially when it comes to rewards. The rewards are of course, of course, spiritual, including eternal life with God, participating in the Beatific Vision, and so much more.

So, Jesus tells the story of the landowner who goes out looking for workers. He hires a large number at 6AM, and they agree upon receiving the usual daily wage of one denarius. The owner is still in need of workers, so he goes out again at 9AM, 12 Noon, 3PM and then finally at 5PM. He tells each group to go to his vineyard, and he will pay them a just wage. Now comes the part that confuses many people, not just then, but now! When the time comes to pay the workers, the owner starts with the people he hired last, who only worked one hour. This group is given the usual day's wage. So, when the people who worked 12 hours saw this they expected to get even more. But they did not, and they were given the same wage, and they were understandably upset! According to most people, the owner was not being just, giving the same reward for harder and longer hours of work.

Keep in mind, that this vineyard is not just a plot of land, it represents the House of Israel and the entire world. The workers were not laboring for wages but were those who were sent out to harvest the lost sheep and all who hear the voice of the Good Shepherd. So in this regard the landowner, God the Father, is being completely fair and just. The Father, through the Son and by the working of the Holy Spirit, is calling us to work in the field. Some of us have been called from the very beginning of our lives, some in the mid-stream of life, and some have been called at the last moments of their lives. It is probably easier to say we have all responded to the call at different times, and we eventually hear it, even though it has always been there. The lesson to be gained by this, is not to be jealous because God is generous with those who have worked a shorter period. No, we should rejoice because this is God's will. As we are told in John's Gospel, He has come to do the will of the One who sent Him. And this is what the Father wants, that all who have been given to the Son be raised up. But this also depends on our free will. Will we use our free will to accept God and all He gives us, or will we reject Him and the Kingdom?

So yes, Peter, you and the others have given up everything to follow Jesus, but as Jesus told you, you will gain so much more in return. Certainly, after the coming of the Holy Spirit, Peter and the others will never ask questions again. They gained wisdom, knowledge, understanding and grace, the same as we do after receiving Baptism and Confirmation. Let us pray that God's generosity will fall upon us always and on all people. That is the wage we should truly seek!

#### Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 26 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

For years we have seen the bumper stickers on cars and most certainly on school buses, and the sticker reads, "Schools Open Drive Carefully." Now during the summer months we do not pay attention to those stickers, but now in September, and for the nine months that follow, we must pay attention to the sticker (not that we should not drive carefully all 12 months of the year). For most of us the first week of school is completed and we only have 39 more to go. # Faith Formation Religious Education

#### Registration Info for the 2020-2021 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation curriculum for public school children in the parish. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and continue their religious formation through grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion later in May of that year. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years in religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in

grades 7 and 8with the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of grade 9.

Due to the COVID Pandemic, RE classes in the fall will delay starting, with Tuesday Lessons starting on Oct. 13th (Wednesday, Oct. 14th, Thursday, Oct. 15th and Sunday, Oct. 18th) with weekly online Google Meet grade level sessions. We are hoping to resume "in school" weekly classes after the Christmas Break. This will give us the time necessary to "open up" safely.


