The Readings for The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Exodus 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." Reading 2 – Hebrews 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

Gospel – Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover. While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

What is the Holy Eucharist? The Holy Eucharist is a Sacrament and a Sacrifice. In the Holy Eucharist, under the appearance of bread and wine, the Lord Jesus is contained, offered, and received. When did Jesus institute the Holy Eucharist? Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper on the night before he died. What happened at the Last Supper when Our Lord said, "This is my body...This is my blood." When Our Lord said, "This is my body" the bread was changed into His body; when He said, "This is my blood" the wine was changed into His blood. Did anything of the bread and the wine remain after they had been changed into our Lord's Body and Blood? After the bread and the wine had been changed into Our Lord's Body and Blood, there remained the appearance of bread What do we mean by the and wine. appearance of bread and wine? By the appearance of bread and wine, we mean that their color, taste, weight, and shape [The appearance of anything are the things we can see touch and taste. The substance of anything is what it is. The appearance of the Holy Eucharist is what it looks like, bread and wine. The substance of the Holy Eucharist is Our Lord Jesus Christ.]

These questions and answers from the Baltimore Catechism (which are basically the same from the current Catechism of the Catholic Church) tell us what it is we celebrate today in this great gift and mystery of our faith, Christ present Body, Blood, Soul, Humanity, and Divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist is not merely a sign or symbol of Jesus, or just a reminder of Jesus, it is truly Jesus! It is Jesus giving Himself to His Church so we may always remain faithful to Him and carry out the Gospel. When we receive the Holy Eucharist, we are healed of all that stands in our way from being one with Christ and the Father who sent Him.

Christ is made present in the Eucharist during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the Eucharist in action. In this action, Jesus gave himself and us to His Father as we are offered up with Jesus. Christ is the hidden priest, and the priest we see, takes His place (acting in the Person of Christ). The Mass reminds us of the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, and this is a living reminder, because we become one with the great act of love. The Mass is the greatest and highest prayer of the Church; it is The Summit and Source of Our **Life.** In fact, it is the most important hour of our week, it is the greatest gift and privilege that we have received, and we should not take Remember there it for granted or not come. are people around the world and even in this country who wish that they could have weekly Mass, but they cannot have it because there are not enough priests to go around. We are fortunate that we still can celebrate Mass every week and even everyday, but if more people do not answer the call to Holy Orders and religious life this can and will change in our lifetime

That is why we are so grateful for all the work that *Father Sean Magaldi* does in his role as *Vocation Director for the Diocese of Rockville Centre*, but I know that he could use all the help he can get. And that help comes from each of us as we can help foster vocations in our families, parish, and anyone that God might be calling to serve in this wonderful vocation.

Fr. Mike's Letter for Week 63 of the Corona Virus Crisis

The following letter was posted last week, prior to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, on the St. Edward's website as well as on Flocknote.

Parts of this letter were written last year to celebrate Trinity Sunday. I thought I could not do better than I did last year to explain this great mystery of our faith so here we go. This Sunday and next, we celebrate two of the three major Solemnities of Our Lord during Ordinary Time. They are Trinity Sunday and next week the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. These two Sundays, help us to focus on two of the greatest mysteries of our faith. We have been given some understanding of these mysteries, but it is not a complete understanding because frankly, they are beyond our human capacity, and I dare say even the full comprehension of the angels. How can we fully comprehend the great mystery of how God exists as One God in Three Divine Persons: the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. While we may be able to recite the Theology behind the mystery or what we learned in the catechism, it is still impossible to have a full understanding of the Trinity. Even when we see God face to face, He will remain a mystery. However, what we can say is that all of God is at work even now to help us achieve salvation and eternal life. All of God is always present to us to help us endure everything this world can throw at us. As we have seen this past year the world is throwing a great deal at us and it never seems to end. The virus was not enough, the lockdown, was not enough, and now we have unrest, political arguments, and wars in various parts of the world. This causes us to ask, Lord when will this end?

As I wrote last year, these are the times that try our hearts and our faith. These are the times when we must not give into despair, rather we should turn to God even more. I know we might believe that He is not listening, but He is! Look at the virus, since last year there have been several breakthroughs with treatments that have speeded up healings for those who are suffering with the virus. We now have vaccines which seem to be working, and things have opened, where we can be at full capacity. While we still have unrest, protest marches, and war raging in the Middle East, we know the solution to these troubles is simple, human beings must act like human beings who live in a civilized society. We must not forget the rules and morals that make America great. Those who break the law must be punished according to the law and must be held responsible for the violence and destruction they caused. God does indeed hear our prayers and we must continue to pray. We must not lose our faith and we must ask God to fill our hearts with the grace and love of the Holy Spirit. When we allow the Spirit into our lives, we can face anything.

We are all frustrated, we all want our normal lives back, and in the near future this will happen. Next weekend we will celebrate, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. We normally have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament on this day following the 11:30 Mass, but we cannot have the procession outside as we normally do. So, this year we will process with the Blessed Sacrament through the Church like we did on Holy Thursday Night. Hopefully, this time the fire alarm will not go off!

Again, please do not lose heart, do not allow these trying times to destroy you and your faith. God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is indeed present and will be with us until the end of time and beyond. Remember Jesus told us that fear is useless, what is necessary is trust.

Rededication of our St. Edward the Confessor Shrine



Next Saturday, June 12th, following the 5:00 pm Mass, Fr. Mike will bless and rededicate our newly refurbished St. Edward the Confessor Shrine located on the front lawn of the Church.

St. Edward the Confessor, our parish patron saint, ruled as king of England from 1042 A.D. to 1066 A.D. He was known as a good and fair ruler over his people. His piety and charity were well known throughout the land. When you look at the statue of St.

Edward you will notice, in his left hand, he is holding a church building. This is because Edward was the one who had the beautiful Westminster Abby constructed. In his other hand he holds a golden ring. The legend regarding the ring is that at the dedication of a church in honor of St. John the Evangelist, a beggar asked Edward for alms. Having already given away the money he had with him; Edward gave the man a gold ring from his finger. Subsequently two men were on their way to Jerusalem and encountered St. John the Evangelist. St. John told them he had been disguised as the beggar to whom Edward had given the gold ring. St. John requested that the men return the ring to Edward.

Please join us next Saturday and make it a point when you are here to stop by the shrine to pray and ask our patron saint, St. Edward the Confessor, to intercede to the Lord on your behalf.





Registration Info for the 2021-2022 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education is an 8 year faith formation program. Public School Students are required to begin their religious studies in grade 1 and finish their classes in grade 8.

Preparation for the reception of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion takes place in grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Reconciliation in March of grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of grade 2. Grades 3 through 6 are required continuation years for students in their religious education studies. Preparation for Confirmation occurs in grades 7 and 8. Students will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Fall of grade 9.

After a year of virtual learning due to the pandemic, we are planning to resume in school classes for religious studies come this fall. Our tentative opening date for Sunday classes is September 26th with weekday classes scheduled to begin the following week.

Families whose children were enrolled in Religious Education Classes last year, should have received a Registration Email on May 17th. These emails will be sent out again during the summer. If you did not receive this email on May 17th, please contact Mrs. Braun at abraun@st-edwards.org
