From Fr. Mike's Desk

Many years ago, Kermit the Frog sang about how it was not easy being Green, and yet what was first a lament would end up on a happy note, with the comment that Green was the color of spring and tall trees. As we see in this week's readings, one could say that it is not easy to follow God's will or to be Christ's disciple. The Prophet Jeremiah had the most unpopular job of anyone in the Old Testament. He was constantly sent out to warn the people of their utter destruction. This destruction would occur because the people as a whole had turned away from doing God's will. As history tells us, the Babylonians conquered the Southern Kingdom of Judah, and for a period of seventy years, the cream of Judah's society was in exile. They would remain in Babylon until the Persian Empire conquered Babylon and set Israel free. Jeremiah told the truth, but the people refused to listen to him. As a result, it led them to put the Prophet into a mud-filled cistern, hoping to silence him. Their plan failed, but it does show us the type of life he lived in God's service.

Today we have Jesus telling us, "I have come to set the earth on fire...Do you think that I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Jesus tells us we will have division among family members, friends, fellow citizens, and the like. However, this prediction about division does not seem to be a part of the Christian Message. No, the Message speaks of peace, forgiveness, harmony, and love. Yet this talk of division is a part of the Message, because so many in the world do not want to listen to the Message, and in fact, they want it destroyed. Governments around the world and throughout history have taken steps to deride the Message and persecute those who follow it. Family members have disowned members of their family who become one with Christ, even to this very hour.

Discipleship has always demanded a cost, one way or another, and from all of us! That is, if we allow our faith to be truly alive and change our lives. If we merely acknowledge the Gospel, but never let it profoundly change who we are and how we react to things happening in this world, we

are not being true disciples. No, we are then essentially being bystanders and not really paying any cost! However, if we want to be more than bystanders, we must seek to make the world a better place according to the Christian Message, and as Jesus tells us, that can bring about Fire in our lives. Still, no matter what cost we pay, it will be worth it. Moreover, no matter what we give up, we will gain so much more in return! Think of how good it feels to know you have done something good for others and how good it feels to know that you are doing God's will. Think of how awful it feels to be selfish and have put your will before God. Which would you want to experience?

Enjoy the rest of your summer and appreciate all that you see is Green (keep a frog happy).

Adult Bible Study at St. Edward's

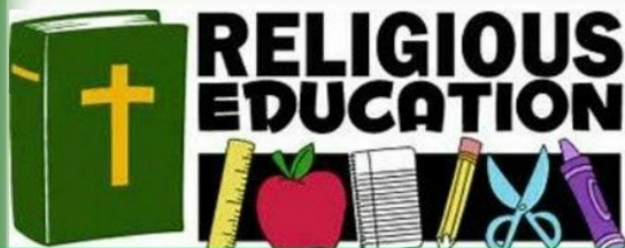
Adult Bible Study is now offered at St. Edward's every **Wednesday** from **7:00 PM to 8:30 PM** in the Holy Family Room.

Registration Info for the 2025-2026 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education Program is an 8 year faith formation program for children attending public schools or non Catholic private schools. Religious Education Students are required to begin their religious studies in Grade 1 and complete their formal religious education classes in Grade 8.

Preparation for their reception of First Confession and First Holy Communion takes place in Grades 1 and 2. Students will receive their First Confession in March of Grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of same year. Grades 3 - 6 are required continuation years for their studies. Confirmation studies occurs in Grades 7 and 8, with their Confirmation in the Fall of 9th Grade.

In Person Religion Classes will begin the week of September 28th.

Families whose children were enrolled in SEC Religious Education Classes last year should have received a Registration Email on June 5th. If you have not yet registered and have not received any re-registration email, please contact Mrs. Braun at 516-921-8543 x 124 or by emailing her at abraun@st-edwards.org

Did You Know...?

This coming Wednesday is the **Memorial of Saint Bernard**, Abbott and Doctor of the Church. Bernard was born in 1090 at Fontaine, in France, of a good family. When he was 22, after having studied grammar and rhetoric, he entered the monastery founded by Robert of Molesme at Cîteaux (in Latin, Cistercium -- the order centered around the monastery was thus known as Cistercians). Twelve companions joined him, including four brothers, an uncle, and a cousin. Following his example, many of his relatives undertook to enter religious life.

In his work *On Loving God*, Bernard points out the path of humility in order to achieve love of God. He exhorts us to love God without measure. For the Cistercian monk, there are four fundamental degrees or grades of love:

- **Love of oneself for oneself:** "First, one loves oneself for one's own sake. Seeing, then, that by himself he cannot subsist, he begins to seek God by means of faith."
- **Love of God for love of self:** "In the second grade, then, one loves God, but for oneself, not for Him. Beginning then to attend to God and to honor Him, in relation to one's own needs."
- **Love of God for God:** "The soul passes to the third grade, loving God not for oneself, but for Him. In this degree we stop for a long time; indeed, I do not know if in this life it is possible to reach the fourth grade."
- **Love of self for God:** "That degree, that is, in which one loves himself only for love of God. Then, there will be a wonderful almost forgetfulness of self, almost abandoning of oneself so that everything tends toward God, so much so as to be one spirit only with Him."

Among the writings of St. Bernard is also the celebrated elegy of the monastic military order of the Templars, founded in 1119 by a group of knights under the guidance of Hugues de Payens, from Champagne, a relative of Bernard. Bernard of Clairvaux died on 20 August 1153; he was proclaimed a saint by Pope Alexander III in 1174. Pope Pius XII dedicated an encyclical to him, entitled *Doctor Mellifluus*, in which he recalled, in particular, these words of St. Bernard: "*Jesus is honey on the lips, melody in the ear, joy in the heart.*"

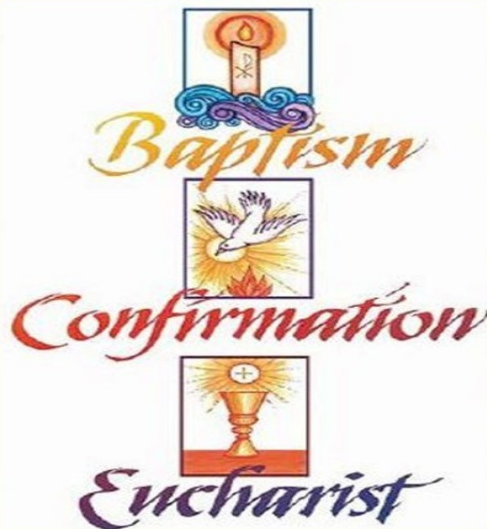

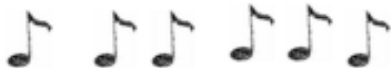

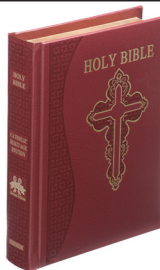
