

From Fr. Mike's Desk

The opening and closing credits of the BBC Program, Keeping Up Appearances, show the main character, Hyacinth Bucket (who pronounces her last name as Bouquet), preparing her table for one of her elegant dinner parties. On the table, she has her best china, silverware, and place cards where the guests will sit. For all to be perfect, each guest must sit in the proper place around the table. If you have seen the show, you know that Hyacinth, played by Patricia Routledge, is always trying to take a higher social station, which she does not occupy according to English Social Standards. As often as she wants people to think she is of the upper crust, her family and those who know her help her to realize exactly where she belongs. Hyacinth's actions and plans always backfire on her, and we know that would not happen if she were honest with herself about who she really is and stopped Keeping Up Appearances!

Today's Gospel Reading and Jesus' comments would be perfect for poor Hyacinth. He tells us today the true meaning of humility. He tells us how leading a humble life will help us on our journey to Heaven. Christianity defines humility as that quality which helps a person submit himself or herself to God and others for the good of all. Humility is said to be the foundation of spiritual edifice and is inferior only to faith. However, humility is the first virtue since it removes all obstacles to faith. It removes pride and makes one subject to and a fit recipient of grace. Humility comprises the following attributes: 1. Submission to God and all legitimate authority, 2. Recognition of the virtues and talents of others, particularly those that surpass one's own, and giving due honor when required, 3. Recognition of limits to our talents, abilities, or authority and not reaching for what is beyond our grasp.

As Christians, we must try to avoid False Humility, which consists of belittling one's own sanctity, gifts, talents, and accomplishments for the sake of receiving praise from others. In short, be proud of your humility! Christ's call for humility is essential for us to know truly who we are before God and others and to remind us that we all belong to God our Father. To stress this point even more, and as a way to share what we have with others, Jesus urges that we know the poor and share life with them. Not just to know about the poor, but to know the poor as they truly are. We should desire to help the poor because it is how we follow the Gospel and show our love for one another. We should

not act for any other reason. One feasible way to get to know those in need is through supporting or helping at Parish Social Ministry or our St. Vincent de Paul Conference (serving both St. Edward's and Holy Name of Jesus).

We close with this prayer for the Virtue of Humility (found on Catholic Online): Lord Jesus, when you walked the earth, your humility obscured your Kingship. Your meekness confused the arrogant, hindering them from grasping your purpose, your nobleness attending to the destitute. Teach me to model after your eminence, to subject my human nature to humility. Grant me a natural inclination to never view myself greater than anyone. Banish all lingering sparks of self-importance that could elevate me greater than you. Let my heart always imitate your humility!

We also pray for all our area's students, teachers, administrators, and school staff, as school opens this week. May this be the best year ever!

Adult Bible Study at St. Edward's


Adult Bible Study is now offered at St. Edward's every **Wednesday** from **7:00 PM to 8:30 PM** in the Holy Family Room.

Care For Our Common Home

For Christians, believing in one God who is trinitarian communion suggests that the Trinity has left its mark on all creation. Saint Bonaventure went so far as to say that human beings, before sin, were able to see how each creature "testifies that God is three". The reflection of the Trinity was there to be recognized in nature "when that book was open to man and our eyes had not yet become darkened". The Franciscan saint teaches us that each creature bears in itself a specifically Trinitarian structure, so real that it could be readily Contemplated if only the human gaze were not so partial, dark and fragile. In this way, he points out to us the challenge of trying to read reality in a Trinitarian key.

Registration Info for the 2025-2026 School Year



St. Edward's Religious Education Program is an 8 year faith formation program for children attending public schools or non Catholic private schools. Religious Education Students are required to begin their religious studies in Grade 1 and complete their formal religious education classes in Grade 8.

Preparation for their reception of First Confession and First Holy Communion takes place in Grades 1 and 2. Students will receive

their First Confession in March of Grade 2 and their First Holy Communion in May of same year. Grades 3 - 6 are required continuation years for their studies. Confirmation studies occurs in Grades 7 and 8, with their Confirmation in the Fall of 9th Grade.

In Person Religion Classes will begin the week of September 28th.
