

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today's Gospel gives us the account of the Ten Lepers, who came to Jesus to be cured. They stood some distance away (about 50 yds) and yelled, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" Jesus answered them with, "Go show yourselves to the priests." We are told that as they went on their way, they were cured, and their skin returned to normal. One of them, realizing that he was cured, returned to Jesus to give thanks. He was a Samaritan, and Jesus replied, "Ten were cleansed, were there not? Where are the other nine?"

Jesus is disappointed by the response (or lack of one) on the part of the nine, and He seems even a little amazed that the one who returned was a foreigner. Why is it that the nine never returned to give thanks? Were they truly ungrateful? Were they so caught up with their own lives that they did not care? As I mentioned in past years, with this passage, Jesus' cure, along with the blessing by the priests, would allow the nine to return to their normal lives. They were so caught up with this prospect that all they could do was rush home to reunite with their families and their friends. Who could blame them? Yet there is a lesson to be learned here. Now, Jesus is not so petty that he needs a thank you, but Jesus is upset that they received this great gift from God and seem to take it for granted!

This passage is the same one we use for Thanksgiving Day. The day on which we, as a nation, thank God for all the blessings bestowed upon us. This is the day we remember how God is with us in good times and when we are facing troubles. Jesus is telling us not to be like the nine; we must never take God for granted, nor should we do so with the people in our lives. We must strive to be grateful for the blessings, great and small, we receive from God and others. Yes, we all have days when we receive nothing but curses instead of blessings; however, even in these times, God has blessed us. Why, because on these days He has not abandoned us, but has supported us.

Jesus gives us His very self every day in the

celebration of the Eucharist. Eucharist, the very word means to give thanks. So, we are always thanking Jesus for giving us His body and blood, soul, and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. This allows us to become more like Christ and grow closer to Him and to each other. Maybe the nine gave thanks later, maybe they even sought out Jesus later in the day, we will never know for sure, but the Samaritan acted rightly, because he sought out Jesus and recognized the power of God in Jesus, and he was humbled.

Can we do the same? Will we do the same, or just say that is what God is supposed to do? Think about your answer, and how and why you have thanked God in your life. Think of it as being a warm-up for Thanksgiving Day.



Adult Bible Study at St. Edward's


The **Adult Bible Study Group** will resume meeting on Wednesday, October 15th in the Cenacle Room. Fr. Hyacinth will lead the group.

Care for Our Common Home

In 1971, eight years after Pacem in Terris, Blessed Pope Paul VI referred to the ecological concern as "a tragic consequence" of unchecked human activity: "Due to an ill-considered exploitation of nature, humanity runs the risk of destroying it and becoming in turn a victim of this degradation". He spoke in similar terms to the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations about the potential for an "ecological catastrophe under the effective explosion of industrial civilization", and stressed "the urgent need for a radical change in the conduct of humanity", inasmuch as "the most extraordinary scientific advances, the most amazing technical abilities, the most astonishing economic growth, unless they are accompanied by authentic social and moral progress, will definitively turn against man"


