From Fr. Mike's Desk

So, are you ready for another set of parables from Jesus, and some of them deal with the Kingdom of Heaven? Well, we will see them this week and next week, so get ready and listen to the word of God. Last week's Gospel told us why Jesus spoke in parables, and today it does the same. Last week, we read that Jesus spoke in parables so that those who had ears could hear and understand. This week, we read that the parables announce what has been laid hidden from the foundation of the world. Again, one needs to have the wisdom to truly hear and understand, as we see in St. Paul's Letter. As Paul writes, "The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit...intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the one who searches hearts knows what the intention of the Spirit is, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will." This is true of our prayers and of our being open to what God wants us to hear this week about the Kingdom.

So, what is this Kingdom like? It is like a Mustard Seed, which is so small that it would be expected to produce something equally small, yet when it grows, it becomes one of the largest bushes. The Kingdom is like Yeast put into flour, which makes the dough rise to become much bigger and feeds so many. As the mustard seeds grow into a large bush, and the flour becomes a greater mass of dough, so must the Kingdom of Heaven increase in size within us. It starts out slowly in us from the moment of our Baptism, but as we grow in wisdom and grace, the Kingdom will grow at a faster rate. Yes, the Kingdom will grow in our hearts and soul stronger and faster if we allow it, and if we acknowledge all God wants to teach us since the foundation of the world. More on the Kingdom next week.

Now, let us turn our focus to the parable of the Weeds and the Wheat. We are told that the farmer's field was excellent and that the finest wheat was sown, but as the wheat began to grow, so did weeds. The owner of the field tells us that

this is the work of an enemy, and Jesus tells us that the enemy is the Evil One who is trying to kill the wheat by choking it with the weeds (sin, temptation, and lies). We are the wheat that Jesus at the end of time will take into the harvest (The Kingdom of Heaven), and the weeds will be fully destroyed when Christ comes again. The situation spoken about in this parable is about life on this side of the Kingdom. It tells us how we must struggle in this world and how we must not let the weeds choke us. However, as we see in the other parables of the Kingdom, from today's Gospel, we can get through this trial if we focus on the Kingdom, which again starts small and grows. So do not allow the weeds to get to you, unless of course they are the ones found on your lawn or flowerbeds.

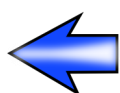


Earthquakes Devastate Venezuela - You Can Help

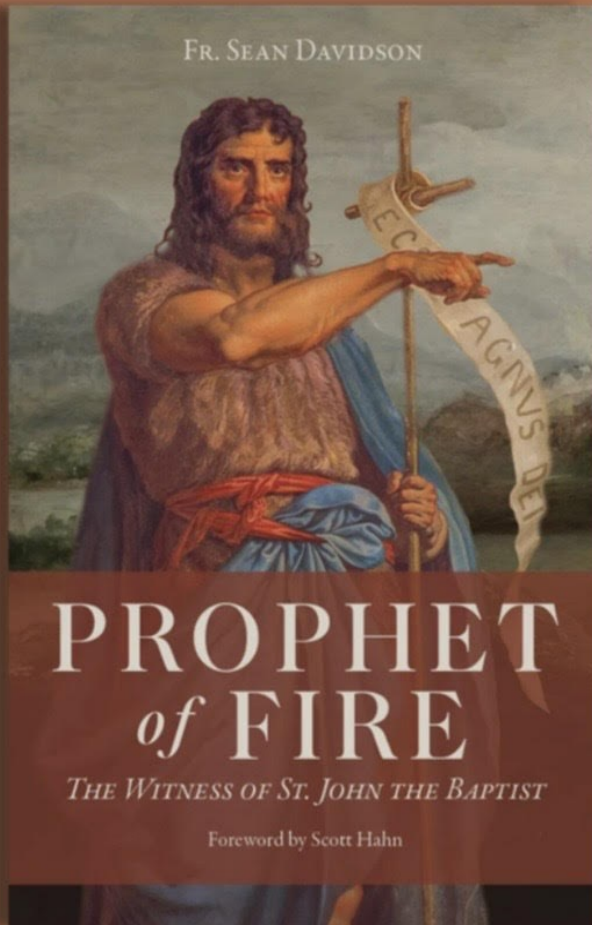

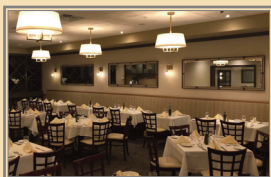

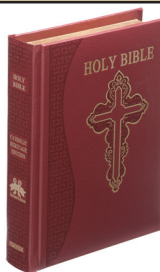


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
