#### From Fr. Mike's Desk

"Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised." This is the question the angels asked the women who came to the tomb on that very first Easter Sunday. Imagine their surprise as they came to the tomb expecting to conduct the traditional respect for the dead, and His body was not there. Think of the thousands of questions going through their minds as they hear He has been raised. Where did He go? What does it mean that He was raised? How did all this happen? Many questions and no answers, except for the statements made by the angels! In another Gospel account for this day, we see that there are no direct answers to the questions, but those who came to the tomb begin to understand. They started to believe without seeing, as they remembered what Jesus said, as they remembered the events of the Transfiguration and the Last Supper. Peter and John saw the burial clothes, and they knew that it was a deliberate act, and not the work of grave robbers or of those who wished to disprove the whole Paschal Mystery. They began to understand (although not fully) that this was indeed a deliberate act, an act of The Son of God. This belief would soon be verified as Mary Magdalene saw and spoke to the Risen Jesus, and when the two disciples would walk and talk with Him on the Road to Emmaus (even though at first, they did not recognize Him).

This belief is verified every time we gather as the Living Body of Christ to pray, worship, and celebrate the Sacraments. We see the Risen Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, the Gospel, and in each other. Today we remember the events of the First Easter, not just in hearing the story, but also in the renewal of our Baptismal Promises, for the Sacrament of Baptism is the sacrament that contains everything about Easter. In the waters of Baptism, we die with Christ on the Cross, and we rise with Him to new life. The new life of the Resurrection sets us free from sin, darkness, and spiritual death. Through Baptism, we become one with Christ and each other, this is how we can see the Risen Lord in each other.

Rejoice today, tomorrow, and for the whole Fifty Days of Easter. Allow the Resurrection of Christ to change your life every day and share the joy of the Resurrection with everyone you meet.

We close with this prayer:

God our Father, by raising Christ your Son you conquered the power of death and opened for us the way to eternal life. Let our celebration today rise and renew our lives by the Spirit within us. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives, and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter to you and your families in this Jubilee Year of Hope!

Our celebration of Easter rekindles our hope each year.

The Tomb is empty! Jesus is Risen!

A wealthy man and a member of the Sanhedrin, St. Joseph of Arimathea is one of those Gospel characters with a very brief but very important role.

In John 19:38-42, we see that after Jesus' Crucifixion, Joseph of Arimathea asks Pilate for permission to take away Our Lord's Body. This was a bold and courageous act of faith from a man "seeking the Kingdom of God." (Mark 15:43)

Joseph and Nicodemus together place our Lord's Body reverently in linen cloths prepared with myrrh, aloes and spices: "Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden a new tomb where no one had ever been laid. So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, as the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there."

In his commentary on the Gospel of Matthew, Fr. Simeon Leiva-Merikakis gives tribute to Joseph of Arimathea. He writes: "And how can we fail to do homage to Joseph of Arimathea? In performing a very humane corporal work of mercy by seeking out and burying the corpse of his beloved Teacher, Joseph becomes for all time a living icon of the eternal Father himself, stooping with compassion to enfold within his throbbing breast the mangled body of his beloved, Son, whom he himself handed over to sinners out of love for mankind. At long last, the Son of God on earth has fallen into the hands, not of a sinner, but of a just and compassionate man! Joseph of Arimathea enacts the justice and love of God himself."

As we celebrate Easter Sunday, the Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and the Easter Season, let us remember and ask the intercession of the great Joseph of Arimathea who prepared the Tomb of Christ and the Body of Christ with such sensitive care and compassion, such faith, courage and reverence. The Tomb is Empty! He is Risen!


## **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)**

#### God's architect declared Venerable

Born in 1852, Antoni Gaudí i Cornet accepted the task of directing the project of the *Basilica of the Sagrada Familia* in Barcelona in 1883. His focus was making art a hymn of praise to the Lord and he considered it his mission to make God known and bring people closer to Him. On June 7, 1926, he was struck by a tram. Not recognized, he was taken to the Hospital de la Santa Creu, the city's hospital for the poor. After receiving the last sacraments, he died three days later, on June 10. Around 30,000 people attended his funeral.

## Did You Know....?

#### Contemplation...

Have you ever wondered what you would have been like and what you would have believed if you had lived in the same town and grown up with Jesus in Nazareth? As a child, you may have played with him. As a teenager you may have shared thoughts and laughter with him. But as you both became adults and he entered into his three-year Ministry and proclaiming the kingdom of God, what would you have thought then? Would you have been able to believe that your playmate and your friend of previous years was truly the son of God? Would you have been one of his followers as he began his Crusade of performing miracles throughout all Judea? Or would you have been skeptical and a non-believer, possibly even a Critic and in total denial of his teachings? And as you saw him progress throughout the land preaching that he was the son of God performing numerous miracles that he was somehow able to do, what then would your thoughts be? As he gained more and more followers believing in him, trusting in Him, would you also be in that crowd? Or would you be frightened by the Roman soldiers who always seem to be threatening in the background, watching him, carefully, cautiously, almost ready to pounce? Would you have sided with the Pharisees and scribes who felt he was a blasphemer and threatened the very culture of their faith? And when he rode into Jerusalem on a donkey as people proudly put down Palms on the ground and waved them in the air, crying "Hosanna to the Messiah", would you have been crying it with them? Or would you be skeptically standing outside the crowd wondering how they could truly believe this man was the son of God? When he was brought before Pilate, would you be standing in the crowd yelling "Crucify Him!" or protesting the very thought of it? When Pilate threw up his hands and told the soldiers to take him away to be whipped and crucified, would you speak up on his behalf or remain mute and watching in helpless silence? And when you saw the whips tear in to his tender flesh and the thorns from his mock crown piercing into his head, would your heart be breaking on his behalf as was his mother's or would you continue in your cynicism? As he slowly strove on his way to Calvary underneath the burden of that heavy cross, would you have been a willing Simon, lifting some of the weight from his bruised and bloodied back, or would you have pushed back deeper into the crowd to remain unseen and therefore unavailable? And after he fell the second time, would you have reached out to comfort him as Veronica did with her veil, wiping the blood and spittle from his face, or would you simply stand there and watch helplessly as he struggled to get up and continue on to his crucifixion? And as he was nailed to his cross and hung there for three torturous hours with blood slowly steeping from his body and the very life seeping from his soul, would you have wept for him?

Ask yourself: Would I have been a mourner or a mocker? And finally when he cried out to his father and gave up his last breath, and the Earth began to tremble and the skies grew dark, would you then have believed that this man, your boyhood friend, the man who performed so many miracles, did so much good, and gathered so many believers in his short 3 years of preaching, would you then have believed that this man truly was the son of God? Or would you have needed the proof of the heavy stone being mysteriously rolled away from his tomb three days later and his body missing from within?

What would it have taken for you to finally come to the realization that this man truly was the Son of God, the Savior of the world, who had truly conquered death on Easter Sunday?


