From Fr. Mike's Desk

The Book of Exodus, today's first reading, tells us the story of the people in the desert waiting for Moses to come down from Mt. Sinai. Moses was on the mountain for a long period of time (more than a month) and the people were getting upset. They believed that Moses and even God had abandoned them. Therefore, they were looking for something to hold on to, and thus they forced or convinced Aaron to make them a god of gold. So he created for them a golden calf, which represented the gods and symbols seen in Egypt. God tells Moses to go down to the people for they became depraved, and in fact were returning to their old ways of life. They were returning to their old ways, even after they saw all that God did for them to set them free. God harbors great anger toward the people and He intends to consume them. Moses manages to convince God that this would not be the correct action to take and God pulls back His punishment. Exodus tells us that Moses changed God's mind, however, we must remember that the whole generation wandered throughout the desert for forty years and never saw the Promised Land; however, their children and grandchildren saw it, and became the great nation.

Today's Gospel tell us the Parables of the Lost Sheep and the Woman who had Ten Coins. The first story tells us that the Shepherd will look for the lost sheep bringing it home no matter what. The second tells us about the woman who will do anything to find her lost coin, just as God will do for a person caught in sin. The Gospel then ends with the great story of the Prodigal Son and it tells us how the loving father is really God the Father, and how He shows His constant mercy and forgiveness to all. Commentators tell us that Jesus offers these three stories, because of the criticisms of the Pharisees and the Scribes who complained that Our Lord was eating with sinners and tax collectors.


Now we seem to have a problem, God as we see Him in today's Gospel and in Paul's letter seem to be quite different from God as He appears in Exodus. God in Exodus is ready to show His wrath, whereas the Father (as Jesus tells us) is always ready to forgive. So what gives? The answer is that the God seen in the Old Testament is the same God of the New Testament. In all truth, God has not changed in how He relates to us. No, **we have changed** in our understanding of God and our relationship with Him. The people in the desert did not have the same concept of God that we have. After all, they were a violent, oppressed people who did not yet totally understand the Covenant with God and the loving relationship God wanted with them. However, keep in mind that God never stopped loving them. Still Old Testament writing shows where they were and how much they had to grow. So, did God intend to destroy the people or was He testing Moses? Was Moses able to realize what Abraham did when he spoke to God about Sodom and Gomorrah, and how God would have saved the cities if they changed! It appears that he did, which is why he seemed to convince God not to destroy the people. God did not intend to destroy the people, even in His great anger!

Remember that God, through Abraham and Moses, was preparing the people for a fuller relationship, and God was angry because the people were throwing up a roadblock between Him and themselves. God did not stop His relationship with the people in the desert. He continued it with Joshua, the Judges, Kings David and Solomon, the Prophets and St. John the Baptist. At the end He came Himself, in the person of Jesus. In Jesus, God showed what He really is all about and how He wants to be with us. Today God does this through His Church, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and His Divine Presence in the Blessed Sacrament.

He also does it through you and me!
