Gospel – Mark 5:21-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other
side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed
close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named
Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and
pleaded earnestly with him, saying, “My daughter is at
the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her
that she may get well and live.” He went off with him,
and a large

There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for
twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of
many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she
was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard
about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and
touched his cloak. She said, “If I but touch his clothes, I
shall be cured.” Immediately her flow of blood dried up.
She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction.
Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him,
turned around in the crowd and asked, “*Who has
touched my clothes?*” But his disciples said to Jesus,
“You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet
you ask, ‘Who touched me?’” And he looked around to
see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had
happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She
fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He
said to her, “*Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in
peace and be cured of your affliction.*”

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue
official’s house arrived and said, “Your daughter has
died; why trouble the teacher any longer?”
Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to
the synagogue official, “*Do not be afraid; just have
faith.*” He did not allow anyone to accompany him
inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of
James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue
official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping
and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them,
“*Why this commotion and weeping? The child is
not dead but asleep.*” And they ridiculed him.
Then he put them all out. He took along the child’s
father and mother and those who were with him and
entered the room where the child was. He took the
child by the hand and said to her, “*Talitha koum,*”
which means, “*Little girl, I say to you, arise!*” The
girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and
walked around. At that they were utterly astounded.
He gave strict orders that no one should know this
and said that she should be given something to eat.

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Today *the Book of Wisdom* tells us that death does not come from God, and that God does not rejoice in death. According to ancient Jewish Tradition, death and illness came about because of sin and the work of the devil. For if sin did not enter the human family as a result of the sin of Adam and Eve, we would have died in a pleasant way and we would pass from our side of the Kingdom to God's side without pain or fear. As a consequence of sin, death is sometimes painful, usually feared, and many certainly want to avoid it. While today we know that physical death and illness are not a result of people's sins or their relatives' sins. Illness and faith are nonetheless tied together in today's Gospel.

Jarius came to Jesus because his daughter was sick and dying. He asked Jesus to heal her and Jesus without pausing for a minute goes to heal his sick child. On the way there, the woman who was suffering with a hemorrhage comes up to Jesus, touches Him and she is totally cured. We are told that she went to many doctors and they could not find a cure. One might think that she would have given up all hope, but she does not, and she believes that Jesus can heal her. So strong is her faith that she believes that she does not even have to ask for a cure, just touch His cloak. She was right, for she was healed, and the second Jesus realizes it He turns around looking for the person who touched Him. However, when He spots her, as she gave herself up, Jesus does not scold her, but says to the woman that her faith has saved her. Jarius likewise has this faith in Jesus that is why he sought Jesus out.

Death does not come from God, and as we see in the rest of the Gospel account, death is not stronger than God, as Jesus brings the little girl back to life. Many times, when illness attacks, we sometimes give into fear and anger. We may even believe that God has abandoned us or a loved one, (as some may believe during the past year and maybe even now) but this is not true. Through the actions in today's Gospel, faith in Jesus grew on the part of Jarius and his family, the woman with the hemorrhage, the Apostles, and the gathered crowd. They most assuredly would remember that moment when Jesus' healing power was seen and they would share this story with everyone they met, and in turn their faith in Jesus would grow. We should do the same thing for we have it a little better than Jarius and the woman, for we too have Jesus and all He does for us, and we have the Holy Spirit to help us get passed all fear and anger. The Holy Spirit also comforts and heals us in body and soul.

The Holy Spirit comes to us, especially in the *Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick*. An important part of this Sacrament is the forgiveness of sins, which is why it can only be celebrated by a bishop or a priest, and this is so we can get passed the fear and anger that sin brings with it. The anointing is done with olive oil which is blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass,

and the words used in the anointing are: *Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you and heal you through the power of the Holy Spirit (this is said while the person's forehead is anointed). May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up again (this is said while the person's hands are being anointed).* This Sacrament was never intended to be a sacrament reserved only for the end of life, somehow that became the practice during the late Middle Ages, and it stayed that way right up to *the Second Vatican Council*. The Council Fathers restored the Sacrament to its proper place, and it once more took on the name of the Anointing of the Sick instead of *Extreme Unction (meaning last anointing)*. This Sacrament is to be received by anyone suffering from serious illness, about to undergo surgery, or suffering from the effects of old age. It is not reserved solely for those who are about to die, and one can receive it more than once in a lifetime. In fact, one can receive it more than once during the occurrence of the same illness or condition. **This Sacrament is not to be taken lightly and it is not to be used for something minor or short term, and in no way is it to replace the Sacrament of Reconciliation.**

From last week, Mark has Jesus sleeping on a cushion in the stern because that is the place of honor and only very important persons rate a cushion.






