

From Fr. Mike's Desk

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and we prayed over the mystery of how the One, True God exists in Three Divine Persons: The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit. This week, as we do every year, we follow that mystery with another great mystery of our faith, the Divine Presence of Jesus in His Body and Blood in the Bread and Wine of the Blessed Sacrament. I will write about this mystery with the Church's teaching, found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Starting with #1323 (page 334 in the hard cover edition), we read, "At the Last Supper, on the night he was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the Sacrifice of the Cross throughout the ages...to enliven his beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of his death and resurrection, a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a Paschal Banquet in which Christ is consumed, the mind is filled with grace, as a pledge of future glory is given to us." As the Catechism continues, we read familiar, but also especially important words. "The Eucharist is the Source and Summit of the Christian Life." In and through the Eucharist, we share communion in the Divine Life and unity with the People of God. Through the Eucharist, we unite ourselves with the Heavenly Liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be overall. The word Eucharist comes from the Greek words EUCHARISTEN and EULOGEIN, which is an action of thanksgiving. The Eucharist is also the Holy Sacrifice because it makes present the one sacrifice of Christ and it includes the Church's offering. When we speak about the sacrificial nature of the Eucharist, we also can correctly say; the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is a sacrifice of praise, a spiritual sacrifice, a pure sacrifice that is offered by our Divine Lord to complete and surpass all of the sacrifices of the Old Covenant.

At the heart of the Eucharist is the Bread and Wine that, by the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, become Christ's Body and Blood. As the Church remains faithful to Jesus' command that we do this in memory of Him. Thus, the Eucharist is indeed the Sacrifice of Christ, but it is also a meal. In the sense of Sacred Scripture, the meal is not merely the recollection of past events, but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become present and real. It makes present the salvation won for us by Christ and takes us back to the Cross. At the Mass, the victim on the Cross is the same victim on the Altar, and the benefits gained from 2025 years ago are likewise gained for us as we gather in the celebration. The whole Church is united through the Eucharist, the Pope and Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious, and Laity. All in Heaven are united with us, the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph, St. Edward, all the angels and saints. Likewise, we offer the Eucharist for all the faithful departed, who are still on their journey to Heaven.

The presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament begins at the moment of Consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic Species (bread and wine) subsist. Christ is present wholly and entirely in each of the Species. The presence of Christ remains until consumed. As it is the presence of Christ, we can worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament as we pray before the Tabernacle, participate and celebrate Adoration and Processions. As the Catechism tells us in #1380, "It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain present to His Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take His departure from His own in His visible form, He wanted to give us this Sacramental Presence..." In His Eucharistic Presence He remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loves us and gave Himself up for us, and He remains under signs that express and communicate this love.

Oh, what a mystery it is, and we are united in it, with it, and through it, if we are to have life!

We Have Been Made for Great Things

In giving us this Bread and Wine, Jesus makes us realize we have been made for great things, higher things. By looking toward the things above, which is consistent with the call to be "born from above" (see Jn. 3:3), Jesus reveals the perspective through which we are called to look on life – not stopping at earthly things, looking only horizontally (see Col. 3:1-4), but looking up, aiming high. The Eucharist is the Sacrament which catapults us toward the things of Heaven. It invites us to think higher, in a vertical dimension, according to God and not according to others (see Mk. 8:33). Toward that end, the Eucharist is offered to us as nourishment, strength, the bread from heaven so that "whoever eats my flesh will live because of me, will live forever" (see Jn. 6:51, 54). This, and only this, can deliver us from a flat and trivial life.


