From Fr. Mike's Desk

We have now come to the turning point of our Advent Journey. While we are still focusing on the Second Coming of Jesus and the end time, we now begin to look at Jesus' First Coming. We do this today by looking more at His Third Coming: Jesus at work in our present life and in the Church's life for the past 2,025 years. As I mentioned last week, John asks Jesus an important question. Herod imprisoned John because he preached against the King for marrying his wife, Herodias (who was originally the wife of Herod's brother Philip). This, of course, was an unlawful marriage, and John would not let up in his condemnation of it and his constant call for Herod and Herodias to repent.

John, upon hearing what Jesus was doing and what He was saying, sent his disciples to Jesus to ask, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Why does John ask this question? As we see in other Gospel accounts, John is so sure that Jesus is the one; he points Him out to Andrew and John. He tells them to behold the Lamb of God and that Jesus was their new Rabbi. Is John going through a crisis of faith? Is it possible that John no longer believes that Jesus is the Messiah? But John's question comes from a different set of circumstances. John still has faith, but he needs understanding. Recall last week, John said that one who was to follow him would clear his threshing floor and gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn in unquenchable fire. John has the impression that the Messiah would be a no-nonsense person, and we had all better follow him, or we would be totally lost. This, of course, is true, yet John does not see this in Jesus. He sees Jesus forgiving sinners, preaching about love and forgiveness and mercy, and He speaks about a loving God and Father. Jesus is gentle, kind, compassionate, and He will go out of His way to find and rescue the lost sheep. He eats with sinners and tax collectors, and He breaks the Sabbath Laws by healing people on the Sabbath. John is not sure, so he asks the question.

Jesus answers John with, "...what [do you] hear and see; the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them." All these acts fulfilled the Law and the Prophets, and Jesus is acting as the Messiah was supposed to; however, there was more to Jesus. Jesus was also acting as who He is, The Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. Jesus is both human and divine (as we will celebrate 10 days from now). Therefore, Christ has the power to forgive sins and to call people back to Himself. Jesus, who is our Lord and God, surpasses the ancient understandings of the Messiah. Afterward, Jesus praises John, yet in the same speech, He puts things in the proper order. John, who has one foot in the Old Testament, is wonderful, but those who are born again into the Kingdom are greater. Do not feel sorry for John, because he also has the other foot in the New Testament, so he too is a citizen of the Kingdom.

As we consider this week's readings, we are all faced with the question: have there been times when we doubted Jesus, especially when we see so much of what is happening in this world, and even in our lives? I am sure that the answer is yes, and it is true of most of us. When we ask this question, we remember His answer to John. That answer again reminds us of all He did and continues to do, even to this day, through the actions of the Saints and His Living Body, the Church. Take heart in the words from the Psalms -

"The God keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry...sight to the blind...the Lord protects strangers."

When Joseph awoke, he did as he was instructed.

We are told that Joseph was a good and righteous man, and that he was unwilling to expose Mary to shame. He had a plan, until he listened to the Lord's messenger. Joseph had faith and trust in the Lord. Could you put aside your own plan to follow the path that the Lord has laid before you?




