
### July Vicar's Vagaries

Ecclesiastes 1:9

<sup>9</sup> What has been is what will be, and what has been done is what will be done; there is nothing new under the sun.

Spiraling toward the elections, we are being bombarded with the perennial question,

"Are you better off than you were 4 years ago?"



Truth be told, many of us will think not. But many of us will be prone to assign the failures of the last four years. to our political opponents, their lackeys, or their targets, some of us will recognize the folly of such questions for its meaninglessness and deception.

The perils of the last four years. have been due to, (among other things,) demagogues, natural forces, global economics, mass violence, or a dreadful lack of imagination on the part of some of our public leadership, whether elected, in civil service, or in commercial enterprise. 
