VICAR'S VAGARIES

"From Ascension to Pentecost: Waiting in Hope, Moving in Faith"

As we journey from the Feast of the Ascension (celebrated this year on Thursday, May 29) toward Pentecost Sunday (June 8), the lectionary invites us into a sacred space of waiting, watching, and preparing. It is a time full of both expectation and mission.

In the days after His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples, teaching and encouraging them. Then, as we read in **Acts 1:6-11**, He was taken up into heaven—not as an absence, but as a shift. The Risen Christ now reigns from the right hand of God, and the work of His Body—the Church—is now entrusted to us, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

But before that Spirit descends, the disciples are told to wait.

This is where we find ourselves in the lectionary during these days between **Ascension** and **Pentecost**:

- •Acts 1:6-14 shows the disciples returning to the upper room, devoting themselves to prayer and choosing leaders.
- •1 Peter continues to encourage believers facing trials, calling them to humility, perseverance, and trust.
- •John 17 offers Jesus' great high priestly prayer where He prays for His followers to be one, even as He and the Father are one.

These texts remind us that the Church doesn't leap into mission unprepared or alone. First, we pray, we listen, and we **wa**it.

Waiting is not easy—but it's where faith is forged. In the upper room, the early believers didn't know how or when the Spirit would come. But they trusted. They stayed together. They prepared their hearts.

This is a beautiful reflection for us as a parish. As we navigate a changing world, make decisions about ministry, and imagine what faithful witness looks like in 2025, we too are invited to be a people of prayerful anticipation.

So let this time between Ascension and Pentecost be for us:

- •A time of quiet courage, trusting that God is at work even when we can't see it.
- •A time of **community**, gathering in faith just as the disciples did.
- •A time of **expectancy**, knowing that God's Spirit will come—and already stirs among us.

Come, Holy Spirit. Empower your Church anew.

NOTICE: OZONE GENERATOR IN USE

We have installed an **ozone generator** in the Parish Hall. It operates daily from 12:00am - 2:00am.

Ozone generators are used to eliminate odors, mold, bacteria, and other airborne contaminants. They work by producing ozone (O_3) , a powerful oxidizing gas that breaks down pollutants in the air.



DO NOT ENTER while the machine is running.

Why?

While effective for cleaning, ozone is hazardous to humans and animals when inhaled. Breathing ozone can cause:

- Throat irritation
- Coughing and shortness of breath
- •Chest pain
- •Aggravation of asthma or other lung conditions

The Parish Hall is to remain unoccupied from 12:00am - 4:00am to allow for safe and effective treatment. Once the ozone cycle is complete, it is safe to re-enter.

The Spirit at Work Among Us

The feast of **Pentecost**, on June 8th, is not just a single Sunday—it marks the beginning of an entire season in which we live into the power and presence of the **Holy Spirit**.

Symbolism in the Stained Glass Windows at St. Andrew's

As you face the altar, on the front right side are the Trinity season medallions. The symbols for Trinity include combinations of three.

On the left medallion you see the dove with the cross and hands. This is to remind us of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and the gifts we each possess.

The center medallion represents the sacrament of Marriage, depicted by the Tree of Life with life water flowing from the base as well as the joined rings. Chi Rho signifies the joining of man and woman in unending union with the presence of Christ

The right medallion in this group depicts three fish to signify that man's salvation comes from the triune God. The intertwining emphasizes the doctrine of equality, unity, and the coeternal nature of the three persons of the Trinity. The circle symbolizes eternity because it is without beginning and without end.
