

### NOVEMBER VICAR'S VAGARIES

#### THE GIFTS WE DENY OURSELVES

Tamara and David Larson and I have just completed our stint at the annual Diocesan convention. Our principal presenter, The Rev. Canon Arienne Davison, offered us a way of understanding different groups through the many different filters culture presents.

Besides the differences things like ethnicity, race, and common sexual orientation or experience may present, many unstated, unknown, or unconscious aspects, of our human experience, (our cultural upbringing, if you will,) affect various practices or processes of decision-making within faith communities everywhere.

Some controversies occur within small parish groups not only because of the topics challenging our progress and values many issues present, but also because of the inability of us to understand the different experiences and histories we bring to our conversations.

#### Canon Davidson suggests that while

Christians share common prayers, Interpretations of scripture, or baptismal promises, but they understand and live out those commitments differently. Depending on their local culture.

Many in our parish are very heavily invested culturally in the historic character of our church and building. Others take a quite passionate mindset toward our Columbarium, (affected in no small part by those things reminding them of the cultural impact of their own deaths on the future of our very community of Faith.)

This by no means detracts from their passionate and devout involvement in their many fruitful faith-filled, life-giving vocations in community housing, outreach to the poor, and other noble spiritual and devotional tasks.

There persists the challenge of helping others discern whether they are being called to closer communion with Us in these similar vocations. Are they yearning for the gifts we enjoy, unaware of our potential, as we ourselves continue to sell our own giftedness short by the cultural differences that continue to keep us on the periphery of our own community of call?

Does our impatience or lack of understanding of one another drain us of the energy we think necessary to reach out vulnerably to those who might bring not only their yearnings and needs but their gifts for the Mission?

handing out candy and for touching the lives of many, if just for a few seconds.






Your contribution, however small, keeps our traditions alive, our doors open, and our hearts warm.

## The Lake Chelan Food Bank is currently serving 1000 families each month.

They are hard-pressed to keep food on the shelves, which are currently mostly bare. Please consider supporting the food bank with a monetary donation.

**The Food Pantry -** We are collecting *non-perishable, no/low prep* (open & eat) meals/food items for the 24/7 (monitored) Food Pantry.

Examples of acceptable items: Heat & Eat soups/ stews, tuna/meat (pouches or cans), Spam, individual servings/packages of jerky, trail mix, nuts, boxed milk, pre-packaged meals, etc. Note: cans should have pull tab lids for ease of use/preparation.

We are also collecting travel or motel sized hygiene items such as soaps, shampoo/conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrushes, etc. There will be a box in the Social Hall for donations.


