St. Andrew's lost a faithful member and friend when Imogene Blair died December 22, 2010 at 97 years young. We will miss Imie "bouncing" into church Sunday morning greeting people as she made her way down the aisle to "her" seat —third row, right side next to the window.

Imie was pragmatic, caring and helpful. She was usually the first on the scene with a casserole or cookies to someone that needed comfort or help. She enjoyed people, and after years working at the Chelan Post Office knew many she called friend. She would make the rounds at Lake Chelan Hospital visiting the ill and elderly on a regular basis.

Born in Waterville she came to Chelan with her family in 1929 where her pharmacist father went to work at Mundt's Drug Store. Imie graduated with Chelan High School Class of 1931, many of whom became lifelong friends. She married Norm Blair of Chelan in 1935, eventually living in the house built by Norm's father on Gibson Ave. Norm and Imie celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary at St. Andrew's in 1985, and was widowed in 1998.

On the day she retired from the post office Norm picked her up at work in the RV he had just bought, and they began years of traveling up the Alcan Highway, a railroad trip to Mexico with the RV on a flat car, and to Yuma, Arizona in the winter.

Those trips up the Alcan Highway to Alaska and the Kenai Peninsula were an adventure in the 1960's when most of the road was still gravel and it was a necessity to carry extra tires, tools and perhaps a radiator or two. Towns and service stations were rare and there were many miles of no facilities of any kind. They traveled with friends and caravanned with the three trailers or RV's, staying in touch with each other by CB radios. She was always game for the adventure whether it was traveling or a good game of pinochle along with a laugh or two.

Family was the most important to Imie, and she loved them unconditionally. She felt especially blessed when granddaughter Desiree and great-grandson Khye came to live with her. St. Andrew's has been blessed to have had her with us.
