## **What does our yearly pancake feed have to do with Shrove Tuesday?**

Shrove Tuesday is a term first used in the United Kingdom. It comes from the verb "shriving". English Christians were expected to shrive prior to receiving absolution before the beginning of Lent.

Lutherans, Episcopalians and Roman Catholic churches in the United States are the only ones to observe this old English tradition, which always falls on the last Tuesday before Lent. Shriving gradually became associated with eating rich foods made with eggs, sugar and butter – hence the connection to pancakes. Such foods used up ingredients that were traditionally restricted during the fasting people associated with the Lenten season.
