What is a deacon, and what do they do?

A deacon is one of three ordained offices of the Episcopal Church. The other two are priest and bishop. The first deacons were ordained to help bishops with service to the poor and the distribution of alms. The diaconate's special emphasis is in serving. The sign of the office of deacon is the stole in the color of the season, worn over the left shoulder and fastened under the right arm.

In the Eucharist the deacons read the gospel, may read the Prayers of the People, prepare the altar, help with the distribution of the bread and wine, and proclaim the dismissal. Those who wish to become priests are ordained deacons first. Those who want to become vocational or permanent deacons are becoming an increasingly important part of the church's ministry.

After five years of study and innumerable trips to Spokane for study, consultations, interviews, and meetings, Linda has been accepted for ordination. She has chosen to serve as a non-stipendiary (unpaid) deacon at St. Andrew's, and will be ordained a priest of the Episcopal Church on the first weekend in June 2010 at the cathedral in Spokane.

As she serves St. Andrew's with helping during services, pastoral care, and "marrying and burying", as she says, she will not receive any stipend. St. Andrew's will pay for any continuing education, expenses for clergy retreats and conferences she is required to attend. She is not expected to spend specified time at the church. How much time she is able to give is her decision, but she will be available if needed. Linda has made the decision not to seek a parish when she is ordained priest, and will stay at St. Andrew's.

We cannot forget the commitment and support that her husband, Rudy, has given Linda through her journey to this special day.
