They will be accepting donations from 8am to noon at the church until June 3.

Out of the 15 houses that Habitat for Humanity has built in the Chelan Valley the proceeds from these garage sales have paid for almost two houses which cost about \$60,000 to build. Celtic Saint Columba; A Celebration of Harmony June 9

Saint Columba was a giant in the Celtic monastic movement. Monasteries in the Celtic Church were not the isolated islands of tranquility in a troubled secular sea that they are often seen as today. Rather, they were the headquarters and refuges of Christianity.

St. Columba left his native Ireland to go to Scotland. In the year 563 he founded the Community of Iona, one of the most influential of such establishments in the Christian world. The mark of Saint Columba's ministry was harmonious community. St. Columba saw harmony between the cultural traditions and the Scriptures and recognized that all learning had value and could be used for the good of the Church.

In everything he did, Saint Columba honored the words of Saint Paul: "Welcome one another, therefore, as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God" (Romans 15:7) Griffen, Celebrating the Celtic Saints,1998
