One of St. Andrew's Own is Ordained to Priesthood

On Saturday, June 5 our very own Linda Mayer was ordained to the Sacred Order of Priests by Bishop Jim Waggoner at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Wenatchee. Many of St. Andrew's church members were there for the ceremony and to celebrate the occasion with Linda and her family. Five other Episcopal clergy from the Diocese of Spokane and Pastor Dan Breznau of the United Methodist Church of Chelan had supporting roles in the service. Other clergy from the Diocese were in attendance and members of St. Andrew's and St. Luke's assisted with the service and reception. Of special note was that Linda's granddaughter, Mandalyn Swinney, served as crucifer.

Linda is a long-time resident of Chelan and at one time provided bookkeeping services for a number of small businesses in the area. In her early years she focused on youth ministry while growing up and attending high school in Canada. She moved to Chelan in 1974 when she married Rudy Mayer. After joining St. Andrew's, she took an interest in training for a number of leadership roles in her new church. In April 2004 she began her studies to become a priest through a part-time training program offered by the Diocese of Spokane. The quarterly weekend sessions and weeks of summer seminars stretched over 6 years and required about 40 trips to Spokane. In the midst of her studies, she and Rudy extensively remodeled their home and remained actively involved in the lives of their grandchildren.

Now that Linda is an Episcopal Priest, she plans to follow the advice of her ordination preacher: "to Pray, to Love, and to be Present."



From the Rector:

How do you define yourself?

Are you an Episcopalian? Or an Anglican? Or a Christian? Or a non-believer?

If we are self-centered and not becoming more Christ-centered all the time....who is it that we serve?

By our fruits we shall be known. God is our judge...and he is no fool.

Who Was St. Luke?

St. Luke could just as easily be called Dr. Luke since St. Paul refers to him as our beloved physician. The author of the gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, Luke accompanied Paul on many of his missionary journeys. After Paul was beheaded, Luke disappears from history, although tradition says he died an old man in Boeotia.

In his gospel, Luke always shows interest in the medical details of Jesus' cures. He is the one, for instance, who reports on the cure of Peter's mother-in-law and gives accounts of the paralyzed man who was let down through the roof, the man with the withered hand, and the woman who had been hemorrhaging for twelve years. He even criticizes his own profession when he says the woman who had been bleeding was "incurable at any doctor's hands."

Any good physician will tell you medicine is as much art as it is science. For physicians to be effective, they not only have to know anatomy and diseases, they also have to understand the human heart. The best doctors look at their patients not just as sick bodies, but as hurting people. They treat not only the disease but also the individual.

No matter what our profession, we must never forget that people are more important than business processes or bottom lines. God loves each of us as if we were the only person alive. We, in turn, must strive to love the image of God in every person we encounter.
