

Have you met our organist Hannah?

In the summer of 1951 a family of seven set off in a Hudson (car) from Cleveland, Ohio, to see the "west", to visit national parks & historic sites, with Manson, WA., their destination. They came because the air & the water were clean. They came because of the beauty of the Chelan Valley. They came to live on Willow Point, just the second (non-native) residents, neighbors of relatives, Bob & Margo Hartley.

I was one of the seven. We took 10 days to come west, stopping at every monument, every important historic site, every scenic overlook, etc. We learned about Lewis & Clark's journey. We learned about geologic features at Yellowstone Park & the Tetons. When we broke over the hill and saw Lake Chelan, we found it the very best place of all.

In the 8 years we lived in Manson, St. Andrew's became a center of our lives. Mary & I learned to play the organ; our dad, John, sang in the choir; mom was involved in the women's group, and created several of the altar hangings and vestments that are

still in use today. We made many friends in the very active youth group.

One year after the family moved to Spokane, Elbert Hubbard & I were married at St. Andrew's and set off for our future in Seattle: college at the UW (with a German major & music minor), teaching in the Northshore School District, where Elbert became an Elementary School principal. Living in Bothell, music continued to be a major focus. I was privileged to play the new pipe organ at Church of the Redeemer in Kenmore and to help lead the Junior Choir. And I began teaching piano which continues to this day.

A special memory at Redeemer is having our one-year-old daughter in her playpen back by the organ while I played for the Midnight Christmas Eve service. We planned to drive to Manson after the service, but were turned back by fog and icy roads in Monroe. The next day, after a night's rest the train was our transportation of choice to

get "home" for Christmas.

Our 31 years in Bothell seemed to be just a long distance commute between our two homes. We built the "cabin" on property adjacent to my parents' old house on Willow Point, and we came over nearly every vacation, at least once a month in good weather and for a month every summer. When it was time for Elbert to retire in 1988, it

was very easy to pack up and head back over the mountains permanently.

Our children stayed on the wet side. Cammie is a senior planner for the city of Mill Creek. She and Spencer have two sons, Dennis, 21, and Josh, 20. Todd is a lawyer working for Snohomish County Legal Services, his wife, Kim, is a nurse with Group Health. Their two sons are Justin, who just graduated from Kamiak High School, and Brett, 16. Our youngest son, Kevin is an electrical engineer employed at Siemens Ultrasound in Issaquah. His wife Jacquie is a speech pathologist currently working at the new Cherry Hill campus of Swedish Hospital. Their oldest daughter, Adrienne, will begin high school next fall. And their famous younger daughter, Danie, will begin 7th grade. They love the water sports in the summer.

It seems that music is in my DNA. I had a great aunt who played organ for the silent movies and had a piano studio. Her sister brought the family to the Episcopal Church in Cleveland because she was needed to play piano for the Sunday School. My aunt Margo and uncle Bob played jazz together and frequently hosted "musicals" in their home. Bob's brother, Walter Hartley, taught Mary & me so much about piano & organ music. It is a joy to play from some of their old music books. And it continues to be a joy

for me to play organ, piano, and guitar at St. Andrews Church.
