Church Customs and Practices

What we do in the course of worshiping God is with what we say or sing. Our physical behavior is the outward expression of our feelings of reverence and devotion. Here are some customs of the Episcopal Church.

Standing: We stand to sing God's praise. We stand to affirm our faith when we say the Creed. We stand in reverence at the reading of the Gospel in the Eucharist. In the Eastern Church it is customary to stand to pray. This practice, which is perfectly permissible in Prayer Book worship, is also followed in many congregations.

Sitting: Usually, we sit to learn so we sit to hear the Word of God read to us. We sit also for the sermon. In some congregations the people sit during the reading of the Psalms.

Kneeling: This is the usual posture when praying. Any reverent posture is appropriate when one consciously comes into the presence of God. We usually kneel to receive the sacrament, except where the parish custom is to receive standing, or personal preference. It is quite proper to receive standing if one cannot kneel.

A Bit of St. Andrew's History – June 18, 1967

From Bishop John Wyatt's Diary on his first visit to Chelan:

June 18, 1967 – Confirmation and Eucharist at Cashmere with Charlie Fox having helped prepare the class and presenting some of his people as well. After lunch to Chelan for a picnic at a parishioner's place on the lake with Dick French, Godfrey White and Doc Phillips on hand with people from all those congregations. A good mixing, interesting potluck supper and ride on Doc's boat on the lake and then a fully garbed choir with the Bishop in Cope and Mitre and Confirmation on the lawn. At least one of the clergy wore tennis shoes under his black cassock and the wind showed that the choir gowns were covering bikinis. I was especially delighted to see the Bishop's Chaplain walking along in bare feet. This lovely balance between building and the outdoors, formality and informality, I think helps a great deal in men's coming to know and recognize God's gracious hand in all His works. Back to our tent (home) on Monday and into the office on Tuesday. The desk piled high.
