## Hannah Hubbard

On Sunday mornings, before you reach the door of St. Andrew's, you are welcomed by the wafting sounds of organ music. When entering the sanctuary, you will see lovely Hannah seated at the organ, playing beautiful hymns. Her music calms our souls and prepares our hearts and minds to worship our Lord.

Hannah is a life-long Episcopalian. Her mother told her that their side of the family began attending Episcopal church when her aunt was asked to play piano for Sunday School in Cleveland Ohio. This family tradition has continued for many decades.

Hannah was 10 years old when her family moved to Manson from Cleveland, Ohio and began attending St. Andrew's. As teenagers, she and sister Mary played the organ for our church services.

Hannah met the love of her life, Elbert Hubbard, in Manson. After they married, they moved to Bothell where both worked for the school district. She was an elementary music teacher and special ed parapro. They had three children, Camille, Todd, and Kevin. After raising their family and retiring, she and Elbert moved back to Manson where they operated a 7-acre apple orchard. Sadly, Elbert passed away in 2019.

Hannah continues to teach piano lessons at her home in Manson. She loves quilting, reading, gardening and pastel painting. She finds great joy in her travels and loves seeing more of this wonderful world. Along with playing for St. Andrew's, she also volunteers her gift of music as an accompanist for the Manson High School and the Chelan Community Choir. She finds great joy spending time with her family which now includes Camille's husband Scott, Todd's partner Emily, Kevin's wife Jacquie, and six darling grandchildren.

The family of St. Andrew's holds a special place in Hannah's heart. They are a loving and caring community of believers and helped her immensely throughout her life. This was especially true during Elbert's illness and after his passing.

Hannah's organ music is a special part of service here at St. Andrew's. Did you know that the beautiful quilts on the wall above her organ and adorning the altar were made by her also?



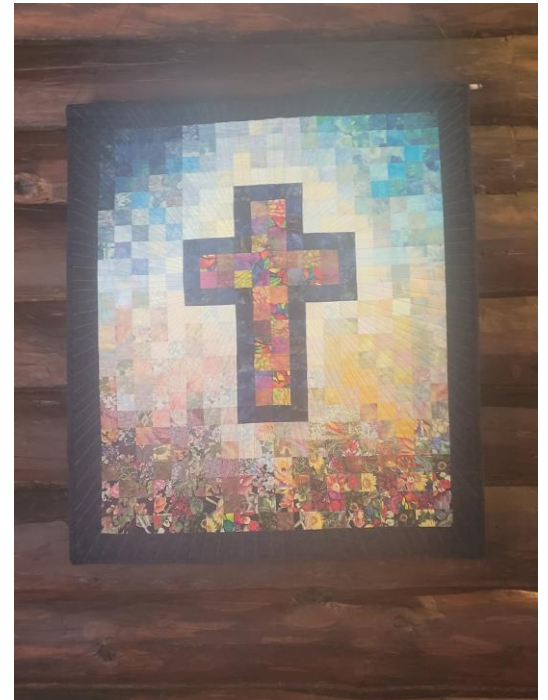
Hannah Hubbard with her Pentecost Bargello wall hanging in St. Andrew's.

**Exodus 26:31** "Make a curtain of blue, purple and scarlet yarn and finely twisted linen, with cherubim woven into it by a skilled worker.

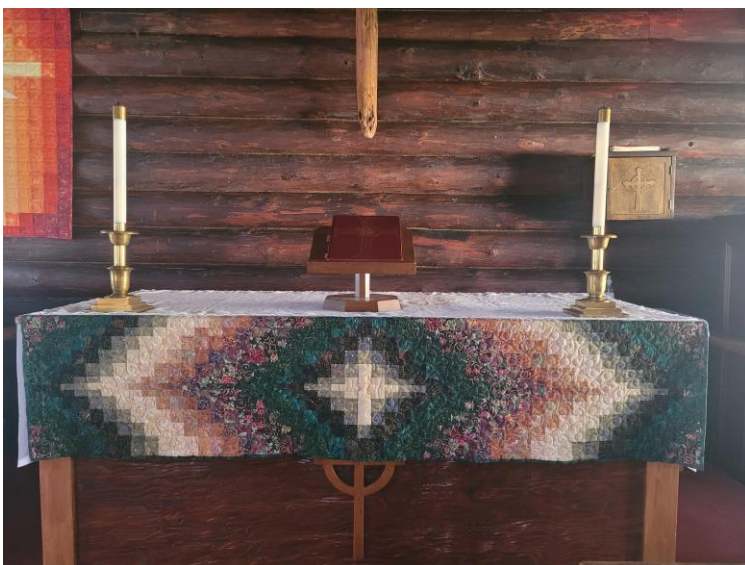
## Hannah Hubbard's Quilts

Hannah Hubbard was in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade, when her grandmother helped her make a square dance dress. This began her life-long journey to develop her sewing craft. In the 1960's and 70's, Hannah sewed most of the clothing she and her family wore, including coats and suits. It wasn't until Hannah and Elbert retired and moved from Bothell to Manson that she became interested in sewing as an art form. She began to quilt.

For the City of Chelan's Centennial Celebration in 2002, Hannah created a St. Andrew's Episcopal Church quilt, utilizing old photos, a log cabin pattern and a central applique of the historic log church. This beautiful and large wall hanging was displayed in the church throughout the summer. In this way, the people of the parish, as well as countless visitors to the community, were able to enjoy Hannah's artistry. Hannah (and Carrie Peterson) won prizes for three of their quilts at the Manson Apple Blossom Festival quilt show, including the Queen's Choice Award – the highest honor. Hannah also made the Parish Banner which hangs in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, in Spokane Washington, along with the other unique banners for all the congregations in the Episcopal Diocese of Spokane.

In the Fall of 2006, Hannah told St. Andrew's parish Rector, Mtr. Melinda St. Clair, that she wanted to knit a prayer shawl, and ongoing ministry of the parish. Mtr. Melinda told her she had something else in mind and asked Hannah instead to quilt a new green altar frontlet, pulpit and lectern antependia with matching veil and burse for the church. Hannah earnestly took up the challenge and began to contemplate which quilt pattern to use. Hannah chose a style of quilt piecing called Bargello. This was the same pattern for which she previously won the Queen's Choice Award.



Hannah's late mother, Elizabeth Cobb, made several of the brocade and appliqued frontlets, falls and chasubles which the Altar Guild and clergy have used since the 1950's. She feels it is a privilege to carry on a family tradition, albeit in a different style. Hannah continued quilting appointments for the other liturgical seasons as well.



Hannah's breathtaking quilt creations were blessed and consecrated for sacred use on Sunday June 9, 2007. They are a perfect complement to the style of our historic church. Thanks be to God for gifting her and calling her to use her talents in service to God's church, making the worship environment all the more beautiful and grace filled.
