She also built a new monastery for her growing community of nuns (with running water), corresponded with the pope, advised not only laity but also priests, wrote numerous letters, composed hymns and sacred plays, and still had time to write down the gist of twenty-six of her symbolic visions dealing with relations between God and humanity.
