Vestry notes: October 13, 2011

Treasurer's report showed that we are currently on budget. Pledges are a bit under, but most are expected to come in by years end.

Energy upgrades were discussed with some yet to be finished. Ceiling vents above the office were inspected and are insulated but may need more in the future. The vestry voted to proceed with a preventive maintenance agreement with North Cascades Heating. This would include twice a year maintenance with change of furnace filters, checking wiring and inspecting the heating/AC system. After cost comparisons, energy efficient light bulbs will be purchased from Kelly's Hardware and used as other bulbs are replaced.

Stewardship month is approaching and the kick-off date is November 20. Hannah Hubbard, Pat LaPorte and Linda Mayer will meet to do the planning.

Linda Cox said that according to the canons of the church, the Diocese is requiring us to have our Annual Meeting between December and February. We have been out of compliance by previously moving our Annual Meeting to April. The date of the **Annual Meeting** will be **February 12**. Mail ballots can be made available for those out of town members to vote for new vestry members and delegates to convention. Committee reports will need to be in to Phyllis by mid January.

There will be three baskets to be raffled off to benefit Episcopal Relief and Development. (more about that following)

Some ideas on how to use our current Outreach funds to benefit our community were Teen Center at the Methodist Church and the Food Bank as well as through Chelan Valley Hope. Details will be reported at the next meeting.

Linda Mayer gave an update on her pastoral care activities for the past month. She has visited with two who are in Hospice, and with some of our members either home bound or in the hospital. (At this writing a funeral is in the planning stage.)

Plants are being cut back in preparation for winter. Larry will pick up the leaves that have blown in from the park and use them for compost.

All Saints day will be celebrated on November 6.

Next Vestry meeting will be November 10 at 4 PM.

**Bishop Jim Waggoner** met with the vestry for dinner on Saturday Oct. 22 and officiated at Eucharist on Sunday, followed by a potluck dinner. It is always a delight to have the Bishop with us and already look forward to his next visit.

#### Three Baskets Raffle

All proceeds will go to help provide assistance to those who desperately need it through Episcopal Relief and Development of the national church.

Some of the projects sponsored by ERD include: mosquito nets, health and sanitation supplies, seeds, animals, school supplies, child and maternal health care, clean water. ERD has also been on the spot in our country to help those devastated by tornadoes, hurricanes and floods.

We will continue to have available at coffee hour a container for you to deposit loose change. All monies collected will be combined with raffle ticket sales to go toward our ERD gift.
