It is doubtful that there are many in the area of Chelan whose life has not been touched one way or another by Rudy Mayer. That was evident during his funeral when there was standing room only in the nave, narthex and parish hall of St. Andrew's, as well as about ten people sitting outside in the cold close to propane heaters. The Rev. Marilyn Wilder officiated and TV was streamed to those in the Parish Hall

A most moving tribute of this quiet and gentle man was given by Julianne Quale described by herself as "Rudy and Linda's fourth daughter because my sisters are their daughters". "He so often quietly went to where he was needed making things generally more comfortable and just. . . better."

Julianne continued, "Rudy's four daughters are a lot handier than we might look . . . and we can drive tractors! We can leap from moving boats, toss a mean ski rope, and lower the stuck boat lift – again. We pick apples, thin trees and hunt down the best orchard asparagus. We hike, camp, snowshoe, and ski, on the water or snow. We can light a fire in the rain." All a tribute to Rudy the teacher as well as the builder and fixer. His delight in grandson Isaiah was obvious, and they spent many hours together using their imagination for building projects.

Rudy had the same mindset at St. Andrew's. Whatever needed doing he was right there, quietly doing repairs or setting up the crèche at Christmas or helping with a landscaping project. He served several terms on the vestry. During Linda's studies for the deaconate and then ordination he was her driver for the many miles back and forth to Spokane and her support system throughout that was unequaled. A letter from Don and Jan Jamtaas expressed it so well.

"Rudy will be so missed by all of us and he will be missed by St. Andrew's in a big way. He gave more time and effort to St. Andrew's than just about anyone. Jan and I still have memories of Rudy up on the church roof with a hose, trying to keep the huge fire next door from reaching the church. He was successful – just like his many other endeavors."

Rudy will stay in the hearts of St. Andrew's. . . . "and Lord, thank you for Rudy"
