

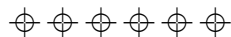

6. **Doug Clearwater's Celebration of Life**—will be held at St. Andrew's on May 16.



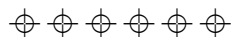
Letter from the Diocese:

Dear Friends,

As your Bishop, I am writing to request a few minutes of your valuable time. As I hope you have heard, we have been working on a Woven as One campaign to strengthen our formation programs and Camp Cross. While the work on this has taken longer than I personally might like, we needed the time to be sure what we are proposing was right for our diocese. Now we are currently conducting a formal Feasibility Study to ascertain the willingness of our members to support the campaign initiatives we have proposed. Your participation and responses are vital in helping us determine our priorities in this next phase. We are relying on you to help determine whether the projects we are proposing will have the support we need to embrace our diocesan vision around Woven as One. Sunday Bible study will be held after coffee hour at 11:30 a.m. The first study to begin on March 1.

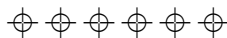
Stained Glass Window- Lent

As you face the altar, on the front left, the fourth set of three windows represent the season of Lent. The pillar or column with the ring and the flagrum symbolize Christ's passion. Rooster is the symbol for St. Peter and contains a warning for steadfastness of faith. The center medallion is sacrament of Penance which prepares us for the forgiveness of our sins. The keys are as the keys to the Kingdom. The Celtic cross is symbolic that we can only receive absolution and forgiveness through Christ. Thirdly the medallion with cross with shroud and three nails depict the nails driven through the palms and feet of Jesus and the crown of thorns are all symbols of Christ's humiliation and suffering. Seasonal color along the lower border is purple.
