

Time was spent evaluating individual strengths/spiritual gifts of the vestry members using a Discovery Tool questionnaire.

Our Christian Symbols

Jesus used symbols again and again. He referred to himself as the Good Shepherd, the Door, the Light of the World, the True Vine. Many of his miracles and parables are filled with symbolism.

Symbols are common in every walk of life. Every day we use symbols of friendship when we shake hands, nod or wave or smile to someone; likewise when we send greeting cards, flowers, or gifts.

There are two great values in symbols: devotional and educational. They help to remind us of the Christian faith, and serve as means of expressing our faith. Symbols can be starting points, object lessons which remain for a long time, in introducing the great themes of our religion.

Symbolism for the Trinity season:

Our stained glass contains symbols of the church seasons as well the sacraments of the church in the round medallions. We are now in the Trinity season of our church year. As you face the altar, on the front right side are the Trinity season medallions.

Most of the symbols for Trinity include combinations of three. The dove with cross and hands are symbolic of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The center medallion is the sacrament of Marriage, depicted by the Tree of Life with life water flowing from the base as well as the joined rings. The Chi Rho signifies the joining of man and woman in unending union with the presence of Christ. The right medallion in this group depicts three fish to signify that man's salvation comes from the triune God. The intertwining emphasizes the doctrine of equality, unity and the eternal nature of the three persons of the Trinity. The circle symbolizes eternity because it is without beginning and without end. The season color along the lower border is green.

There is a little legend about St. Patrick and the Holy Trinity. One version stated that he was near a meadow one day when Irish chieftains asked for an explanation of the Trinity. St. Patrick saw a shamrock with three leaves, plucked it and said in effect: "God is like this flower; this flower has three petals, and the three petals form this shamrock. So God consists of three Persons, and yet is one God."
