As noted in the upcoming events, please help gather signatures to **Protect Our Kids**, and to **Recall Newsom**.

California won a great victory by gathering enough signatures to qualify the initiative to revise parts of **Prop 47** that downgraded most drug crimes, and property theft crimes less than \$950, from felonies to misdemeanors. This initiative seeks to make crime illegal again. Repeat offenders will be charged with felonies and serve jail or prison time.

As Vice-Chair of the Chairmans' Association I want to make our sister counties' dinners as successful as ours. Money helps win elections. The proceeds from our dinner will help get candidates elected.

YCRCC in Action



Johanna Lassaga and many other YCRCC members attended the April MJUSD Board meeting in person and via Zoom. The meeting lasted 3-hours. Johanna expressed her anger to the board that the public comments portion of the meeting was opened at the very end instead of the beginning of the meeting. At the beginning of the meeting, the room was full of parents, but few were still there at the end.



Both **Johanna Lassaga** and **Florentina De Gennaro**

expressed their opposition to the sex education curriculum that is taught to 7th and 9th graders. The textbook that is given to these **MJUSD** students makes no mention of abstinence as being a method to avoid pregnancy or sexually transmitted diseases.

At the very end of the meeting, Julie Lovella expressed her anger that her middle school son was disciplined for being a bully when he "barked" at some "Furries" that barked at him. Furries are students who act out their fantasy of being an animal. Shamefully, some schools in the MJUSD encourage this behavior to the

extent they are given a special space in classrooms and yard duty staff are assigned to watch over them so that they are not bullied. Apparently, it is <u>Not</u> OK for kids to wear Halloween Masks, but it is OK for a Furry to wear an animal mask.

Since, the room was essentially empty by the time the Furry and the sex education topics came up, these complaints were not heard by parents who should have heard them.
