So, you saw what I just saw, but things get worse, let's take a look:

So, I went to the front desk, and they offered me another room a few floors down, on the "clean floor". They said the room is a clean zone. I wasn't sure what that meant, but check out my video of this room:

So, after that horrible discovery of all that dust which was clogging the air filter, I went back downstairs, and they said they would have someone come up and clean it. Nobody ever showed up. my allergies persisted and I took my allergy medicine and Tylenol for the headache.

It would have helped so much if I could open a window, but like most hotels, there is not windows that you can open.

So as far as amenities, you've seen the room, the toiletries, I'm quite sad that for costing \$150-\$250 per night, they don't even give you water or a coffee maker. Water is available for purchase downstairs for \$7.00 per bottle.

I visited the gym, but you have to leave your area of the hotel, walk through the entire casino, and go over where the mgm towers are, and inside there is the small gym. For a grandiose hotel with such opulence, the gym had 4 treadmills, 2 ellipticals, and a weight bench. It was drab. The machines functioned, but out of the 5 tv's on the wall only 2 of them were working. You're supposed to be able to plug in your headphones into the machines and listen to the tv, but this was all broken, so you could only watch the tv's with no sound and there was no closed captioning, so you need to be good at reading lips if you were trying to pay attention.

There's an indoor pool, an outdoor pool, and a spa as well as all the eating establishments. I would say there are plenty of amenities to stay at the resort for your time, and good thing because you are almost 2 miles from the boardwalk, and it is impossible to walk there. You will need to have a car or hire an uber. Oh, and for cars, you will have to pay for parking here, unless of course you have status with your players' club card. And don't worry, all the amenities I just talked about come with a resort fee of \$35 dollars per night, which you can get waived, again if you have high enough player status. But none of this comes cheap.

For attitude,

Let me start by talking about the Amphora Lounge, it is for members only basically gold and platinum guests of the mgm mlife program.

It's a private buffet that Costs 12.99 and includes an open bar. As you know I'm not a big drinker, I will have 1 or 2 from time to time, but I'm not a person who benefits from an open bar. I Waited 20 minutes to enter, and I was Greeted by a server and offered drinks. It's Buffet style so first thing I asked server how to treat dairy my dairy allergy and what he would recommend. I asked if there were labels. He referred to manager who said everything has dairy!!! I looked shocked. he Did not offer to check with the kitchen and looked surprised. I asked him: "am I the first person to ever ask you this and he said yes! He looked annoyed and I said what should I do then? What do you recommend? He said you should just leave! He went over and processed a refund for the 12.99 for the buffet. A VIP buffet and to not be accommodated was sad.

His attitude was so poor. I honestly don't know what foods were there and I can always find something to eat at a buffet! Haha! But he did not want me there and asked me to leave! Very inappropriate and sad representation of the business.

There were nice servers at the Noodles of Now, and the metropolitan, but I'll be honest, this one stung.

There are limited options here when it comes to dairy free. As we know, don't go to amphora lounge - we're not welcome there. For the larger buffet,

Only could eat 25% of offerings. Flavors were "ok". Had minestrone soup, grilled chicken and shrimp cocktail.

Most everything had dairy. Fried chicken, Mac and cheese, the meats, even the fish had cheese and there was a salmon croquette- inside a puff pastry. The plantains were covered with sour cream. Never seen that before.

All desserts I could not eat.

I was there Mon-Thur and most of the fancier dining establishments, which I don't know if they accommodate or not, were not open. I must believe they could try, but I'm not sure.
