SHOW RULES

1. Anyone who wishes to exhibit may do so. However, section and higher awards are limited to American Hosta Society members. Any exhibitor who is not an AHS member and wins a section or higher award will be asked to become an AHS member. If the winner declines membership, the Show Chair may either present the award to the next qualified entry or leave the award vacant. **All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor.**
2. Entries will be received from 3:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. on Friday, June 26 and from 7:30 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. on Saturday, June 27. Entries received after 10:00 A.M. will be placed in the non-competitive exhibit area. Judging will begin at 10:15 A.M. Awards will be presented to winners upon completion of judging. **All entries must remain in place until 4:00 P.M. Sunday 28 June.** Entry tags, ribbons, and leaves may be claimed from 4:00 P.M. to 4:30 P.M. Sunday 28 June. Entries remaining after 4:30 P.M. will be disposed of by the Staging Committee.
3. Entry tags must be properly completed by the exhibitor. Incorrect entry tag information will be corrected by the Classification Committee, if possible, or returned to the exhibitor for correction. Entries may be disqualified by the committee, at its discretion, if misnamed or if displaying extreme damage or signs of disease.
4. Classification information on the entry tags for Division I – Registered Named Cultivars and Species entries shall be based on the current Hosta Show Classification List only or have had registration data recorded in an official publication of The American Hosta Society by the date of the show in order to be considered registered for show purposes. **For this show, an interim Classification List based on the 2026 pilot show schedule will be in effect. Copies of the Interim Classification List will be on hand at the show and the Interim Classification List is posted on the gahosta.org and mnhosta.org website.**
5. During the time of judging, only the Show Chair, Classification Chair, Judges Chair, Clerks Chair, Judges, and Clerks are permitted in the immediate judging area unless otherwise permitted by the Show Chair.
6. Division I – Registered Cut-leaf Entries, Division II – Unregistered Cut-leaf Entries, Division III – Hosta Plants in Containers, and Division IV - Educational Displays will be judged by panels of three or four American Hosta Society judges, including one Master Judge per panel. The American Hosta Society Point Scoring System will be used to break a tie in judging major awards. Each panel of judges will be the final authority on each class/section/division it judges.
7. All decisions of the judges are final.
8. For Division I and Division II - Section II, each named cultivar or species constitutes a separate name sub-class and only one blue, one red, one yellow, or one white ribbon may be awarded in each name sub-class, provided entries score the minimum points required for each ribbon. In Division II – Section I, Division III, and Division IV, each entry is judged on its own unique merit and is eligible to receive the ribbon it deserves based on the point score it earns.

9. Care will be taken, but no responsibility shall be incurred by any person, group, or organization for accidents, damages, injuries, thefts, omissions or commissions of any kind or nature from this show.

10. Division I – Registered Cut-leaf Entries Rules

Containers will be provided by the Minnesota Hosta Society.

Bloom scapes are not permitted in this division.

Each entry will require **ONE** Leaf.

Persons placing entries in Section VIII - Youth Exhibits must be 18 years of age or younger as of the date of the show.

All leaves entered should be representative of the plant as a whole and should be taken from plants approaching maturity. Only one entry of each Registered Cultivar or Species is allowed per exhibitor. **Multiple entries of the same cultivar by an exhibitor are not permitted.**

Sections I through VIII - Each exhibitor is limited to a total of 20 cut leaf entries.

11. Division II – Unregistered Cut-leaf Entries Rules

Containers will be provided by the Minnesota Hosta Society.

Bloom scapes are not permitted in this Division.

Section I - Unregistered Seedlings or Sports require **TWO** leaves per entry. Sports shall be indicated on the entry tag as "Sport of (Name of Cultivar)." Seedlings shall be indicated on the entry tag as "Seedling (Hybridizer's Identification Number)."

Section II – Unregistered Named Hosta Cultivars require **ONE** Leaf. Only one entry of each Unregistered Cultivar or Species is allowed per exhibitor. **Multiple entries of the same cultivar by an exhibitor are not permitted.** All leaves entered should be representative of the plant as a whole and should be taken from plants approaching maturity.

12. Division III – Whole Hosta Plant Displays Rules

Section I – Container Grown Individual Hostas

Container grown entries must have been grown by the exhibitor and must be established in the containers in which they are grown. **Only registered cultivars or hosta species may be exhibited in this division and only one mature hosta plant, which may consist of multiple divisions of that single plant, may be grown in each container.** The container must be clean, but otherwise has no bearing on overall judging of the entry. The plant should be centered in the container. Inner containers or container liners are allowed but must not be visible. Only one type of ground cover material is allowed per exhibit. Ground covers may be any natural non-living material such as bark chips or stones, or an indigenous moss of one variety only.

Section II – Trough/Container Gardens Arranged for Effect

Self-contained trough or container gardens of any size may be entered for judging as an arrangement. Multiple varieties of hostas and other plant material may be used. **Hostas must be a strong focal point of the entry.** No artificial plant material is allowed. Plants and container must be clean. Accessories are permitted. Individual plants need not be identified. However, if

the exhibitor would like to identify the material, an identification ledger card to the side of the exhibit is both acceptable and desirable. Entries must have been grown by the exhibitor.

13. Division IV – Educational Displays

Educational displays must pertain to hostas.

14. Division V – Non-Competitive Exhibits

Entries in this division are not judged. The exhibit may be a single cut leaf, a hosta bloom scape, a container grown plant, or any other display deemed to be of interest to the show observers. However, the plant material must be hosta-predominant, the exhibit must be tastefully presented, and the material must be in good condition. The Show Chair may refuse placement of any exhibit that does not meet these requirements.

15. Division VI – Artistic Display

Displays are of exhibitors' choice, conforming to the very loose Sections described below – be inspired but not limited. Judges will vote for best display in each Section and confer a Best Artistic Display from the Section winners. SHOW AWARDS

Best of Show Award – Awarded to the best entry in Division I – Registered Cut-leaf Entries and is selected from the section winners in Sections I – VIII. The winning entry will receive a Best of Show ribbon.

Best Seedling or Sport Award – Awarded to the best entry in Division II, Section I – Unregistered Seedlings and Sports and is selected from the best entry in this section. Winning entries will receive a Best Seedling or Sport ribbon. Winner must have scored at least 95 points.

Sweepstakes Award – Awarded to the exhibitor who wins the most blue ribbons in Division I – Registered Cut-leaf Entries. In case of a tie, count red ribbons, then yellow ribbons, if necessary, to break the tie. Winning entries will receive a Sweepstakes ribbon.

Grand Awards – Awarded to the best entries in Division III, Section I – Container Grown Individual Hostas; Division III, Section II – Trough/Container Gardens Arranged for Effect; and Division IV – Educational Displays. Winning entries will receive a Grand Award ribbon. All Grand Award winners must have scored at least 95 points.

Section Awards – Awarded to the Best of Section winners in Division I and in Division II, Section II. In Division I, Best of Section winners are selected from the Best of Class winners in each section. Winners will receive a Best of Section ribbon. All Section Award winners must have scored at least 95 points.

Class Awards – Awarded to Best of Class winners in color classes in Division I. Winners will receive a green flat ribbon. All Best of Class award winners must have scored at least 95 points.

The following ribbon awards are awarded in accordance with rules set forth by AHS:

First Place Blue Ribbons	Entries must score 90 or more points to receive this award.
Second Place Red Ribbons	Entries must score 85 or more points to receive this award
Third Place Yellow Ribbons	Entries must score 80 or more points to receive this award.
Fourth Place White Ribbons	Entries must score 75 or more points to receive this award.
