CLUBHOUSE POOL & SPA END OF SEASON

The outdoor pool & spa will close for the winter at sunset on Sunday, September 14th, 2025. This will allow use of the outdoor pool & spa two additional weeks after the Labor Day weekend.

The outdoor furniture will remain in place for a few weeks for those who enjoy sitting outside during daylight hours.

LANDSCAPE EXPENSES EXPLAINED

It is important that all our residents at The Villas at Five Ponds understand that our landscape expenses fall into two categories: contractual and landscape other.

Contractual expenses include mowing of our lawns, pruning twice a year and recurring chemical treatments. These expenses are largely fixed and easy to plan for and budgeted annually. This year, due to an extremely wet and hot spring and summer, an extra mulch bed weed treatment was added.

Landscape other expenses are usually requested by a resident or our landscaper and typically are associated to the health status of trees currently within our property.

When a resident requests an action, by sending a picture along with a note to our property manager, Amy, she then sends a request to our landscaper, Total Turf, to "investigate" the request. The landscaper then provides a written recommendation. Sometimes they concur with the resident's request, sometimes they do not, and sometimes they concur but indicate the request

Realtor + Principal M: 215.740.7204 O: 833.728.2411 achecksold@gmail.com is not needed to be done this season. The Board tries to follow the landscaper's advice, since they are the experts.

Landscape other expenses as the community ages, continues to grow each year, making it very difficult to plan/ budget effectively. Where possible, we may push to the following year so we can plan/budget for the additional expense. It is also important to note that approved plantings for the current year are usually not done until the fall to ensure that the plantings have a greater rate of success.

How big is the landscape other category which covers common ground within our community? At the August Board meeting there were 16 pages with 3 to 5 items per page. It is a time consuming and cumbersome process to coordinate the issues with the landscaper as well as correspond back to the resident after the Board approves/rejects the request. We ask for your patience.

If you are informed in writing that your request will not be acted on, either because the landscaper has indicated to the Board it's not necessary or not necessary at this time, or will put off because of lack of budget funding reasons, the resident does have an alternative.

Alternatively, the resident may hire an insured landscaper to provide them with a written quote for the work required on the common ground near their property, at the resident's own expense just as they might if they were having work done on their own their property. The resident MUST submit a completed Landscape change form along with a quote, and the landscaper's certificate of insurance, to the property manager and wait for Board approval to proceed. It should be noted a member of the Villas at Five Ponds Board followed this process a few years ago and spent about \$900 personally to have work done on the common ground near his property.

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



ANTICA PIZZA COMPANY" NEW IN WARRINGTON - RON DORFMAN

IT MUST BE 10 YEARS or more since this corner location near the Regal Theater complex in Warrington has been occupied. I remember it used a larger space as "Jannie Chinese Restaurant." Now more compact, and outfitted with bright hard tile floors, lighting and tables, it is back in full operation.

Even though Antica is new to the neighborhood, its popularity has apparently taken off.

We made a reservation for four on an early Saturday night, and were warmly greeted and promptly seated. The hard surfaces and numerous families in the dining room generated far more reverberation and background noise than I would have liked for an early dinner. Never-the-less, It's amazing how a cordial server with a sincere smile can guiet the distractions and enhance the dining experience—even when it has the potential to be slightly uncomfortable.

The menu is quite large, and although they don't offer dinner platters as most other Italian restaurant in the neighborhood do, the array of sandwiches, salads, and pizza, is more than sufficient to satisfy any appetite. I ordered the Smoked Beef Brisket - their "famous" sliced beef brisket, served on a fresh round brioche roll with Sweet Baby Ray's Barbecue Sauce, crispy onions, pickles and Cooper Sharp American. A wonderful, very ample sandwich was accompanied by a handsome basket of crisp fries. The taste was excellent, and the barbecue done perfectly. To my surprise, real cutlery and heavy dishware were parts of the service. No plastic basket lined with annoying soggy



paper here! My dining friends ordered a Pork sandwich - a large serving of roast pork, broccoli rabe and sharp provolone cheese on a long-seeded roll. Another friend ordered a gluten-free round crust pizza. The toppings offered are an endless list of goodies that were easy to satisfy even the most discriminant of dinners.

The food was terrific—handsomely presented—hot, and flavorful; and the noise, at the end of the evening, tolerable.

Stopping in for a meal before or after the theater is probably best. I do recommend their food—you' can't go wrong with it—but consider take-out for a guieter—even more enjoyable experience at home.


The offense is still one of the best units in the league, with their starting QB, RB, top 3 wide receivers and top tight end all returning

ROOF REPLACEMENT

As two thirds of the homes in our community have had their roofs replaced, invoices from Lemus have been or shortly will be issued to the residents of these homes. It is important to note that the 25-year warranty for the quad is only issued after all residents of the four homes have paid their invoice in full. If at least one of the homes does not pay their invoice in full the warranty will not be issued to the guad. Why is this the case? The warranty is for the single building that houses the four homes.

When all four homes in the quad pay their invoice, Lemus will then email each homeowner the supporting warranty documentation. In addition, to the warranty each of you will have an opportunity to submit the documentation to your homeowner's insurance company. Several residents have already done so and have been surprised by the annual discount they have received. While the homeowner's savings have varied based upon the existing coverage, every homeowner should take advantage of the potential savings. Please realize the importance of paying your invoice and not deny your neighbors the opportunity to save some money.

She is a #1 New York Times, Amazon Charts, USA Today, Wall Street Journal, Sunday Times and Publisher's Weekly best-selling author.



There is at least one psychopath in the book, the trick is to find out who it is. She likes to give readers pieces of the puzzle to lead them in different directions. She has the twist in mind before she writes the story.
