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DEER IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Found in "Whats Happening In Warminster," from the weekend of Dec. 20th & 21st e-mail:

"Deer population has increased over the past several years How many times have you seen a deer on the side of the road this winter? We can most likely say that we all have. Our deer population has increased over the past several years due to abnormally dry conditions affecting the availability of food sources, prompting deer to travel further in search of food, according to PhillyBurbs.com website. Additionally, the shrinkage of deer habitats and the lack of natural predators have contributed to overpopulation, according to Deer Solution Repellent Service. This organization alerts motorists to be extra careful and "aware" while driving during mating season from mid-October to mid-December.

So, what is Warminster doing to keep our residents safe and protected against the uptick in car accidents and deer fatalities? It's a complicated process—but we are happy to share with you that we

are staying on top of it and appreciate your diligence in bringing the locations to our attention.

You may or may not know that some of our more than 100 miles of roads are divided into "state" and "secondary" roads. For example, Bristol Road, Jacksonville Road, Street Road and County Line Road are all state roads and maintained by PennDOT. Secondary roads are the neighborhood roads where most of us live and these are maintained by our Public Works Department. Our Animal Control Officer, Craig Claycomb, works directly with Public Works and the Police Department to assist with any deer on our roads.

Claycomb explains that if a deer is struck on a state road, it becomes the responsibility of PennDOT and its contractor to clear away the deer. Residents can contact PennDOT directly through their website at www.pa.gov/agencies/penndot or 1-800-349-7623. He said if a deer is found on a secondary road, residents can call the Pennsylvania Gaming Commission at 610-926-3136 or can contact the Police Non-Emergency number at 215.672.1000 and this will get filtered to him."

DOG LICENCES

It is a state requirement to have your dog licensed by January 1 each year so that if lost and found this can assist Claycomb in tracking down the owner. Ways to apply for a dog license are to contact the Bucks County Treasurer at 215.348.6244 or go to their website here. Annual licenses cost \$10.80 or a lifetime license for \$52.80. There are reduced rates for senior citizens or residents with disabilities.

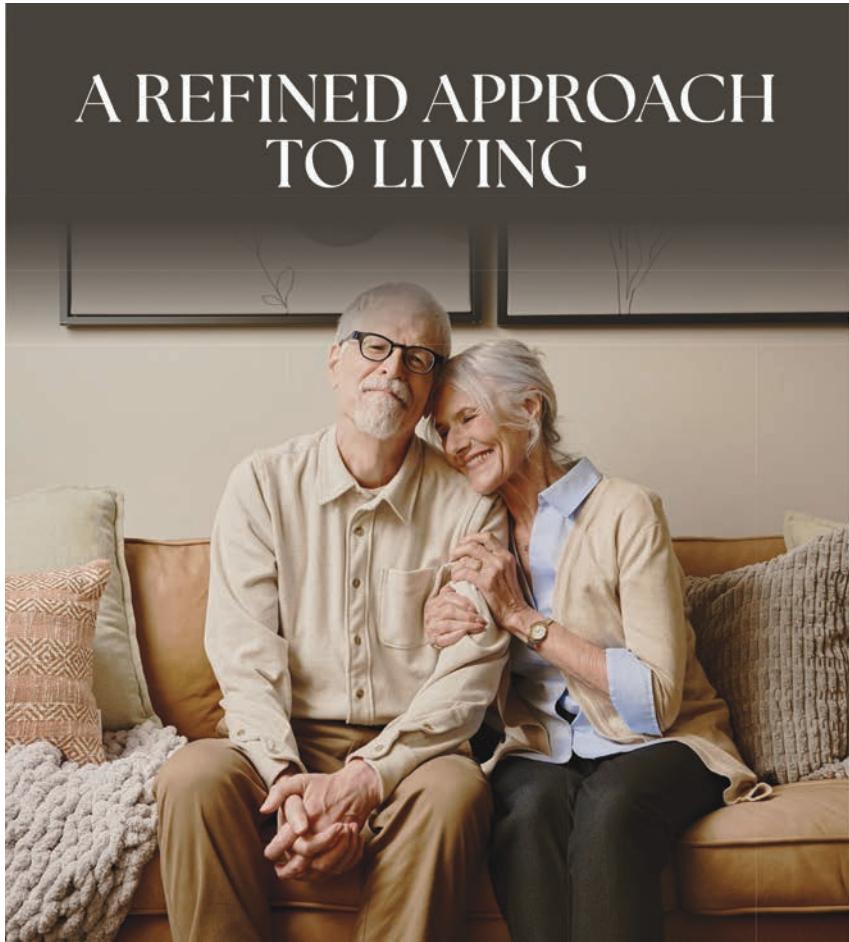

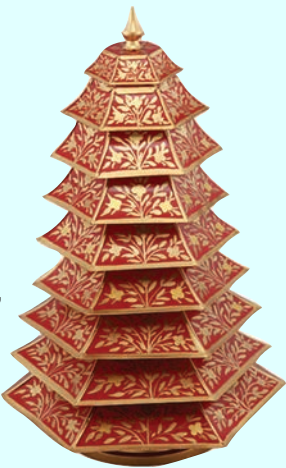

vehicles, two-wheel motorized bicycles, standard bicycles, or scooters for the disabled only. No motor vehicles of any type are permitted to be driven on the lawn areas of Units or the Common Elements. See Declaration, Article XVII, Section 17.01m regarding prohibitions on recreational vehicles, mobile homes, trailers, boats, or trucks, etc.

c. Parking vehicles on the street or in driveways and/or turnaround area is not permitted during a snowstorm. Violations of this rule will result in an immediate \$100 fine. Vehicles that cannot be parked in garages during a snowstorm must be parked in the center parking spots (only) of the clubhouse parking lot at the discretion of the Executive Board. Any potential or temporary changes to this location will be promulgated prior to a snowstorm. Exceptions will be made only by prior written Executive Board approval.

d. Driveway Turn-around spaces can be used for occasional deliveries, but not for parking unless all Unit Owners in that driveway agree to allow parking.

e. Parking in front of or within eight (8) feet on either side of the mailboxes is not permitted at any time. Commercial vehicles may be parked in the Community on a temporary basis only in connection with work on a Unit or Common Element. Parking on the non-sidewalk of streets is not permitted.

f. No Owner or occupant shall leave any non-operating vehicle, any vehicle not currently registered and licensed, or any vehicle having an invalid and expired state motor vehicle inspection sticker parked anywhere on the Property, except if entirely enclosed in the garage. Declaration, Article XVII, Section 17.01m.

SALTING OF WALKWAYS: Reprint of a portion of APPENDIX P from our community rules.

It is not recommended that the homeowner use rock salt (sodiumchloride) on the concrete entry and/or service walk as this product could cause damage, erosion and/or pitting to the concrete surface. It is recommended that calcium chloride, or a similar product be used on concrete surfaces. The Association recommends that throughout the year, the winter season varying and being unpredictable, each homeowner keeps an available supply (bag or container) of calcium chloride, e.g., in the garage, for their personal use in ice mitigation. Both rock salt (sodium chloride) and calcium chloride are acceptable products for deicing on asphalt (driveway) surfaces.

CLUBHOUSE FOBs

Effective immediately, the process for getting Key FOBs at the Villas at Five Ponds is as follows:

For new residents, two Key FOBs should be given to you at the settlement/closing of your new home. We will be notified by the Settlement agent and Continental Management that the transfer has taken place.

If you are a new resident and the Key FOB transfer did not occur or you only received one key FOB at settlement or you're an existing resident and have either lost your Key FOB or possess a broken/not working key FOB or wish to purchase an additional KEY FOB over the allotted two KEY FOBs, you will be required to complete the attached form, which will also be available on the Villas at Five Ponds website within the Residents Only section. A few copies will also be available at the Front Desk. The

form must be completed and sent to the VFP Key FOB Support team at vpkeyfob@gmail.com. If you do not have email capability, you may drop the form off at 52 Villa Drive.

The Key FOB committee will contact you to set up a time to meet at the Clubhouse for handoff. A check to replace a lost or purchase (over the allotted two) Key FOBs for \$40 per unit must be made out to The Villas at Five Ponds Community Association and handed to the VFP KEY FOB Committee upon receipt of the new Key FOBs. For lost and not working/broken Key FOBs, please bring your working Key FOB so that the Committee may identify which Key FOB to deactivate.

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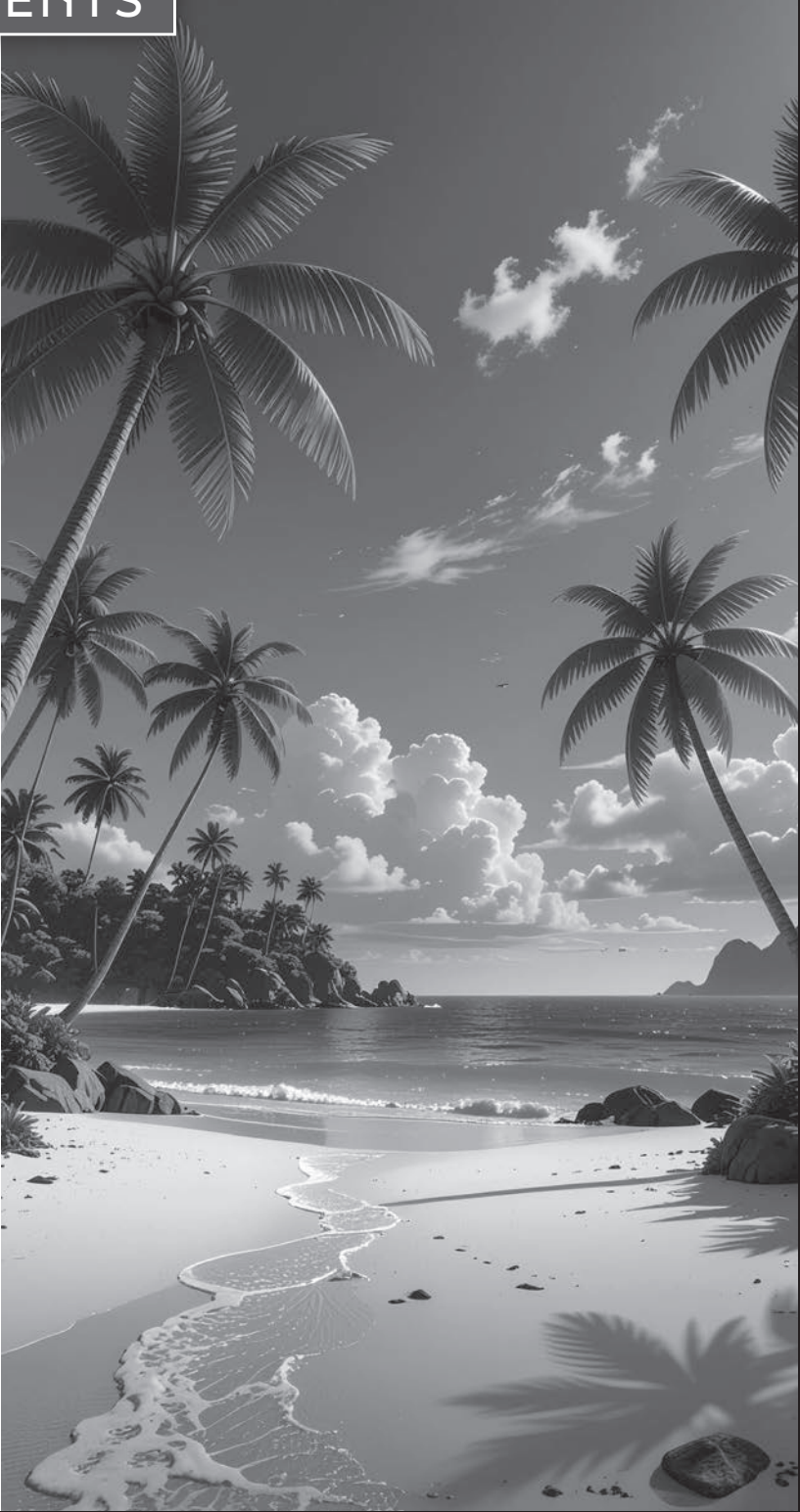
