#### **GUEST ENTRANCE**

Please do not let anyone into our clubhouse or out onto the outdoor pool deck, that is not your guest. The person that opens door for a non-resident, they become your guest, and you become fully responsible for them, while they are in the clubhouse or on the pool deck—guest fee required the person who allows them access.

NOTES: Status of Tennis/Pickleball Court—April 8, 2025 Larry Nodiff and Amy Wert met Brian Douglas from Armor (One of the individuals who created the Armor Product), to inspect the repairs done to the tennis court in late summer of 2023.

Below are notes Amy took from the time spent with Mr. Douglas.

"We inspected the court. The armor crack repair is a material put over individual cracks in the asphalt and then painted over.

In the court you can see areas where armor was applied, it looks like there are wrinkles in it. This is the product doing its job. The material stretches with the shifting asphalt and keeps the crack covered. However, you can see the wrinkles from the movement in the paint which covers the armor repair.

We also observed new cracks throughout the court, Brian said he did not feel any of these cracks were a liability issue, they need to cause a lip or a crack wide enough to catch the side of a shoe and turn an ankle.

The open cracks are new cracks which appeared after the resurfacing.



Brian was very impressed with the tennis court, at 20 years old he felt it looked great. Most courts have an expected life of 25 years and ours is nowhere near ready to be redone.

Regarding the new cracks, the court is made from asphalt. It was built in a good location on top of the hill; but it was built over fill dirt which causes a lot of movement when it settles. We will always get cracks in the asphalt court; it is expected. He recommended in several years we could caulk the cracks; he was very clear that he would not do it now as they will continue to grow. He will send me the contact number for a company that will supply the tennis court caulk for when we need it in several years. He cautioned Larry and I that the next company that comes out to do a resurfacing or painting will not appreciate the caulk because it must be removed prior to doing additional repairs or repainting.

Regarding the rust spots: the paints used on the tennis courts are water-based; there are bits of metal throughout the asphalt that will bleed through the water-based paint. He told us that he uses oil based black spray paint and adds sand before painting the court to avoid the bleeding through. This should be mentioned to the contractor when we work on the court again. He said that you will always see new spots as the years go on.

There is no warranty claim or any issue that is not normal maintenance on the court. He basically said that he understands pickle ball players can be very serious about the aesthetics of the courts and the hardest thing to do is get them to learn to manage their expectations with an Asphalt court. You will get new cracks every time the earth below moves and there is no way to avoid this. We believe he was very knowledgeable and helpful with the issues we have seen with the court."


