For those who missed the document, we have left 100 copies of the form on the lip of the front desk of the clubhouse.

### **How Our Board Election Works**

- 1. Each year there is a Board election. In the even years there are (2) two seats up for election and in the odd years there are (3) three seats up for election.
- a. This year as indicated there are (3) seats up for election, which are presently held by, in alphabetical order, Joel Mickelberg, Rick Rodgers & Mark Schwartz. Mr. Rodgers via a note in The Villa's Voice has indicated he will not re-nominate himself this year.
- 2. All (280) two hundred and eighty owners of the units on or about September 11th should have received notice of the annual meeting and a blank nomination form via postal mail.
- a. Any owner in good standing may nominate themselves by completing the nomination form and making sure it is in the hands of Continental Management, 975 Easton Road, Warrington, PA 18976 by 4 pm. October 6th. 2025.



- 3. The Board would suggest to any owner considering nominating themselves that they should be aware of the following;
- a) You would be expected to attend a monthly meeting of the Board, approximately for 3 hours, usually held on the third Tuesday morning of the month.
- b) Sometimes because of the volume of issues, there are additional meetings necessary within the same month.
- c) The Boards main functions are to oversee the financial "well being" of the community and to oversee and sometimes take an active role in the maintenance and management of our property both from a grounds perspective and maintaining our 10,000 square foot clubhouse, with no direct employees. Some recent examples of those type of functions have been:
- a. Mark is spending hours organizing a 16 page approximately 4 per page, document of landscaping issues so they can be addressed by the Board then the vendor where required.
- b. Larry, recently spent considerable time physically re-arranging things in our storage room so it would pass Fire Marshall inspection.
- c. Karen, has spent countless hours dealing with our website that has been having operational issues.
- d. Joel has been trying his best to get the management at The Warminster Municipal Authority—to provide documented clarification from the EPA about why our clubhouse after 18 years of operation now has to spend thousands of dollars adding "backflow devices", yet this requirement hasn't yet "hit" our individual homes? Joel also recently had to plunge a toilet in the women's locker room-too get it working.

# THE BEST SPORTS RIVALRY YOU'RE NOT

I'LL BE HONEST, Tennis is not a sport I find myself watching all that often. It seems repetitive, the matches are long and I often do not know the players that are competing. However, the past couple years of major tournaments has piqued my interest due to the budding rivalry that is Carlos Alcaraz and Jannik Sinner.

Carlos Alcaraz is a 6 foot 22-year-old Spaniard who is the #1 ranked tennis player in the world at the moment. He has won 23 major titles including 6 grand slams all in the past 4 seasons of professional tennis. He is a finesse player, with stamina that seems to last for the longest of rallies. He's one of those players that is a little flashy, but never comes off as cocky.

Jannik Sinner is a 6 foot 3 24-year-old Italian who has just dropped from #1 to #2 in the world. He has won 20 major titles and 4 grand slams, with all of them coming in the past 2 seasons of professional tennis. Sinner is a power player, maybe not as quick as

Carlos but definitely has a stronger serve. He has a rather robotic motion and personality about him, to the point where some of his opponents have begun to ask if he is "AI".

Sure, there are guys that are often #1 and #2 for a while, but right now, it seems that every grand slam tournament is now a collision course for these 2 to meet in the finals. There are some good young stars like Ben Shelton, Taylor Fritz and Jack Draper along with the legendary Novak Djokovic. However, it just seems like it's destined to be the Spaniard and the Italian meeting when it matters most.

The last 3 grand slam titles have resulted in an Alcaraz/Sinner final match. Alcaraz stunned Sinner in June on clay at the French Open coming from 2 sets down and saving 3 championship points to victory. Sinner responded at Wimbledon in a 4-set convincing victory on grass. We reversed the result yet again a couple weeks back at the US Open on the hard court also winning in 4 sets. I'm expecting this rivalry to continue as long as these phenomenal athletes can continue to stay healthy.




the Pops Gala will be available soon.
