POOL GUEST FEE

AS A REMINDER; beginning, Saturday, May 25th through 2 weeks past Labor Day there is a \$5 per day guest fee for each guest. It is required for any non-resident brought out to the outdoor or indoor pool areas. The one exception is that our single residents are entitled to one free ADULT guest per day.

The \$5 fee is required upon entrance to be placed in the gray ticket box hung on the wall at the hall entrance just before going to the outdoor & indoor pool areas.

The fee can be paid in one of two ways.

1. Five dollars cash for each guest, paper clipped with an identification note, with your name and guest name (s) deposited into the gray ticket collection box. These notes, paper clips & pens are in a box attached to the ticket box.

2. A prepaid pool pass ticket sold in books of 10 passes, from the management company for a \$ 50.00 check made out to the Villas at Five Ponds Community Association. We do have a few of these books in the clubhouse for sale. At this time there are no plans to sell books at a discounted rate. *Note: Passes purchased in prior years are good forever.* Filled out "pool passes" also should be placed into the grey ticket collection box upon entrance.

Residents must accompany all guests, including children, at all times and must assume responsibility for them and their actions. Two adults must be present for more than two children. A maximum of eight (8) people including guests and residents from each Unit is permitted Monday through Friday. On Saturday and Sunday, and holidays, a maximum of six (6) including guests and residents from each Unit is permitted.

No guests are permitted when there are formal community functions taking place at the pool areas.







THE GIRL WITH THE LOUDING VOICE BY ABI DARE



ADUNNI IS A FOURTEEN-YEAR-OLD GIRL who lives in a poor Nigerian village. According to the book of Nigerian facts, Nigeria is the richest country in Africa due to its oil. It has a population of 180 million people. Sadly, over 100 million Nigerians live in poverty, surviving on less than a dollar a day.

She lost her mother who spent all of her days, sick and well, to gather money for school fees. Her father thinks "a girl child is a wasted waste. A thing with no voice, no dreams, no brain." He needed money to pay his community rent so he arranges for Adunni to wed an old man. She would be his third wife. She was traded for four goats, two bags of rice, some chickens and a new TV.

She is naïve and optimistic. Despite the many challenges she has faced, she believes that tomorrow will be better than today. Perhaps this is a trait of Nigerian people. In a 2003 study of over sixty five countries suggested that the happiest and most optimistic

people in the world live in Nigeria. ("The Book of Nigerian Facts - Past and Present").

She goes from subservient wife to a domestic servant of Big Madame, a rich woman in the wealthy city of Lagos. She mistreats Adunni for the slightest infraction. Her husband is a lecher who Adunni tries her best to avoid. When her tasks are completed, she explores the books in Big Madam's library. She studies the history of Nigeria and the dictionary to learn the meaning of words in English. Her story is told in broken English yet it is not difficult to understand. The reader is compelled to read the next chapter to see what will happen to Adunni. Her thirst for knowledge is encouraged by Big Madam's chef as well as an acquaintance of Big Madame who takes an interest in her.

This story is both heart breaking and inspi-

rational at the same time as we experience the journey of a poor fourteen-year-old girl to find her louding voice despite many obstacles.

The book was a *New York Times* best seller and was recommended by Jenna Bush Hager on the *Today Show.*
