SOME POOL USE REMINDERS...

- 1. The last person to leave a table with an umbrella up, is the one responsible for cranking it back down and tying it closed.
- a. We almost lost an umbrella last Friday, when someone left an umbrella open and a storm came through in the late afternoon.
- 2. If your grandchildren wish to take "foam noodles or weights" from the indoor pool storage boxes out to the outdoor pool—please enjoy, but they must be returned to the storage boxes prior to you and they leaving our facility.
- 3. No one in just bathing attire is allowed to go past the doors leading to the fitness center.
- 4. No one 14 years old or younger is permitted in the SPA.

It is kind of "sad" that we have to write these type of common sense reminders, when the great majority of our residents do the right things, and it is a very small minority that do not.

And, of course, if we have to, in most cases, we can identify who that small minority is, should a formal complaint be submitted about an issue or in the case of the umbrella had it been damaged, the responsible party would have been identified and billed for the repair or replacement costs.



Additional reminders:

No one who needs diapers of any kind is permitted in the pools. Younger children, not in diapers, should be taken to taken to the bathroom prior to entering the pool as a precaution.

Also: the outdoor bathrooms are open. They are located in the center of the cabana building.

The \$5 daily guest fee is now required for use of the outdoor pool, SPA, pool deck and indoor pool area. The only exception, single residents are allowed 1 adult guest per day, free.

This fee is to be deposited upon entrance into the "quest pass" box located on the wall at the entrance to the outdoor & indoor pools.

It can be paid with cash + a completely filled out note, paper clipped to it. (Notes, paper clips and pens are in a box attached to the ticket box.) Or, an official Villas at Five Ponds filled out guest pass coupon. These can be purchased with a check made out to the Villas at Five Ponds Community Association for book of 10, for \$ 50.

CLUBHOUSE HVAC UPDATE

As you might be aware, the clubhouse last year had all new HVAC units installed and they do a good job of controlling humidity.

However, our multipurpose room - because of the size and we think the extremely high ceilings- is one of the most vulnerable rooms to high humidity. This is why we have left the large blue dehumidifier in the room as a back up to our HVAC systems.

In addition, we are asking your help in the following way:

- 1. Please insure all doors leading into to the multipurpose room are left closed. All includes:
- a. The entrance doors
- b. The doors to and from the lounge
- c. The emergency exit doors to the outdoor pool area—if you wish to go out to the pool use the correct pool entrance door.

THE BOYS OF SUMMER

THE PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES are the best team in the National League as I sit here on June 16th. They are 4 games ahead of the next best team in what truly has been a historic start to an MLB season. Through 70 games, the Phillies have 47 wins and are an astounding 27-10 in games played at Citizens Bank Park. Has their schedule been weak? Sure, but they are beating the teams they are supposed to beat, getting them battle tested for when they face opponents of tougher competition.

Although it shouldn't be too big of a surprise, the pitching staff is what has carried the Phillies to this start. Sure, they have a great bats in a loaded lineup with a ton of pop, but it's been the starting pitchers that really have guided this team to wins on top of wins. The pitchers have an average ERA of 3.10 (1st in the NL, 3rd in the MLB) aka over 9 innings of play, the Phillies are giving up an average of 3.1 runs per game. Along with that, they lead the league by

25 in pitching strikeouts with 647 (9.24 per game). Zack Wheeler and Ranger Suarez are #1 and #2 in best odds to win the NL Cy Young awards with a 2.16 and 1.77 ERAs respectively.

I can't ignore the bats either, but it seemed to be a team that was mashing the ball much earlier in the season, and have now fit the mold as a pitching first team. However, the Phillies are the only team in the National League who are averaging over 5 runs per game and have scored the most runs per game at home across all major league baseball. They are second in the NL in home runs, led by Bryce Harper's 15 and Kyle Schwarber's 14. They are third in the NL in batting average led by Alec Bohm's incredibly consistent start to the season, and are lead the NL in RBIs also led by Bohm's 55.

The bullpen has been solid, but it was one of the things that let them down in the NLCS last season, and their good start could be a blessing in disguise. Because they have so many "good" relievers at the moment, it may be hard to figure out which guys can handle the high leverage situations once September and October hit. Overall, it's been an extremely positive story for the Phillies. They have the best record in the National League, and are 8 games above anyone else in their division as we are midway through June. It's a long season, the competition will get tough and health will become a factor (as we already see with JT Realmuto and his knee surgery). However, the Phillies have placed themselves in a comfortable spot as we hit the dog days of summer.

OUR MISSING HEARTS BY CELESTE NG



BIRD IS A 12-YEAR-OLD BOY who lives quietly with his father, Ethan, who once was a professor of Linguistics and now is relegated to shelving books at the university library.

His mother, Margaret, left the family three years ago and he doesn't know why. He is living in a dystopian society which is a community or society that is extremely bad or frightening.

After the Crisis, when there was economic hardship and violence, a law was passed to preserve American culture and traditions known as PACT. Library shelves were stripped of books that were considered un-American. Children were removed from

their homes if the family was deemed un-American and placed with more patriotic families. People had to unite against a common







DOG WALKERS!

Dogs must be on a leash at all times and under the control of the Owner, tenant or pet sitter and must be curbed. Dogs may be on a dog tie-out leash on the Owner's Property provided the Owner, tenant or pet sitter is outside, present and in control of the dog at all times. No leash shall be long enough to extend into the driveway, street, or sidewalk areas. Leashes should not be long enough to allow the dogs to extend to the nearest neighbor's property or neighbor's common ground area. Leashes must be removed for lawn maintenance periods. Animal waste must be taken home and disposed of within the Owner's garbage bin. Disposal of solid pet waste in any open area, the Common Elements, storm drain, or on another Owner's Property is strictly prohibited. In no event shall an Owner or occupant of any Unit keep any more than a total of two (2) dogs or cats. Other rules regarding pets can be found in Declaration, Article XVII, Section 17.01h.

Too often, we have residents verbally complain that they observe other residents violating the rules above. It is important to realize that those "few" who do violate these rules are disrespectful to all residents. Our homes are here, and the entire property belongs to all of us.
