THE VILLAS AT FIVE PONDS EXECUTIVE BOARD

SIGNS & KINDS

AS WE APPROACH a major election in our country, a member of our Board suggested that we remind all of our residents of our HOA rules regarding "political, signs, events and meetings." (see below)

a. No sign, banner, flag, billboard, political sign, or advertisement of any kind, including, without limitation, informational signs, "for sale" or "for rent" signs and those of Realtors, contractors and subcontractors, shall be erected on the Property without the prior written consent of the Board. If permission is granted to any Owner to erect a sign within the Unit, the Board reserves the right to restrict the size, shape, color, lettering, height, material and location of the sign, or in the alternative, provide the Owner with a sign to be used for such purposes. Alarm Company signs are permitted in the mulch areas.

f. No political events are permitted in the Multipurpose room, and no political meetings or seminars of any sort will be permitted in any area of the Clubhouse. Religious meetings, classes, or seminars, except for educational purposes, are prohibited in the Clubhouse.

POOL & SPA SEASON

The outdoor pool and SPA is scheduled to close on Monday, September 16th. This will give our community two full weeks after the Labor Day weekend to enjoy our outdoor facilities. The outdoor tables and chairs will remain out a little while longer for your enjoyment as well.

POOL PASSES & GUESTS

Traditionally, The Villas at Five Ponds Board has not required guest passes or fees for use of the indoor pool when the outdoor pool is closed. This year that means from Monday, September 16th, 2024, through Friday, May 23rd, 2025, guest fees and passes will not be required for use of the indoor pool.

However, as always, a resident must accompany all guests when using any VFP facility, which includes the indoor pool. As a reminder, guests are not allowed use of our Fitness Center at any time.




What happens next is spellbinding. I could not put this book down. I finished it in one day.


Remember not to refrigerate these tomatoes, eat them when you bring them home in just a few days, to enjoy this wonderful, delicious treat!


