

#### **TURN-AROUND SPACES**

It has come to our attention, that some of our newer residents, visitors or contractors are treating the black topped "cut out" toward the rear or in some cases on the side of the driveways as a parking spot. It is not a parking spot, it's a space that for the most part should be left vacant in order to make it easier for residents to back out of their garages and then proceed down the driveway onto the street.

It also should be noted, the area is common ground owned by the Association, and not "owned" any individual homeowner.

Unfortunately, it is also the area that when snow must be plowed off the majority of the driveways to allow exit and entrance to and from homeowner garages much of the snow winds up there and for a short period of time, the residents do lose the ease of backing out of their garages.



Below is the Villas of Five Ponds rule regarding use of the turnaround area.

#### **GENERAL**

#### AUTOMOBILES, MOTOR VEHICLES and PARKING

Driveway Turn-around spaces can be used for occasional deliveries, but not for parking unless all Unit Owners in that driveway agree to allow parking.

#### POOL DEHUMIDIFIER

The DEHUMIDIFIER in our indoor pool building is now turned ON.
This means that ALL windows and doors in the indoor pool building must remain CLOSED.

We understand that with pool water being approximately 85 degrees and even on cold winter day, that is sunny, it can get rather warm in the indoor building, unfortunately keeping the room dehumidified takes precedence over maintaining a cooler temperature by opening doors or windows. Thank you for your understanding.

#### MAILBOX AREA PARKING

Parking in front of or within eight (8) feet on either side of the mailboxes is not permitted at any time. Commercial vehicles may be parked in the Community on a temporary basis only in connection with work on a Unit or Common Element. Parking on the non sidewalk of streets is not permitted

#### **LEAF COLLECTION**

The Villas at Five Ponds has contracted with our Landscaper for multiple "leaf clean-ups". The first one was Thursday, October 17th...more to follow. And yes, sometimes it seems like a never ending task.

#### **SNOW & ICE**

Time has come to:

1. To make sure you purchase a few jugs of calcium chloride or magnesium chloride, make sure there is no rock salt in the contents, then store them in your garage so that you can use on your driveway or sidewalk, if we have a snow storm under 2" accumulation\*, which our Association is not responsible for.

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



#### "HOUSE OF GLASS" BY SARAH



"HOUSE OF GLASS" is a psychological thriller that will have you guessing until the end. Stella Hudson is a best interest attorney, appointed to serve as counsel for children in high-conflict custody cases. She usually doesn't accept cases of children under thirteen due to her own traumatic childhood. She is persuaded by Charles, her mentor/father figure, a revered judge, to take the case of Rose Barclay, a nine year old troubled child who witnessed the possible murder of her nanny, because he feels she is the only one who can help.

Rose's parents, Beth and lan are going through a contentious divorce. Ian was seduced by their nanny, Tina, who subsequently became pregnant. They both want custody of Rose who has become mute after witnessing her nanny's death after falling through a third floor window. Rose's grandmother, Harriet, will do anything to keep the family together.

When Stella meets the parents, she realizes the case is more twisted and the Barclay family is far more troubled than she feared. They seem eager to keep Stella

away from Rose. When she is alone with Rose she finds the child will not answer her questions. Rose uses a whiteboard in her room to tell Stella to "go away". Stella find a cache of sharp objects hidden in her room. The house has no glass in it. The windows are



made of plexiglass and the glasses are made of plastic. The housekeeper is scolded when she is observed using a glass measuring cup for a recipe. Ian explains that his wife has a phobia of glass.

The suspects in the death of the nanny could be Beth, Ian, Tina's boyfriend, Rose's piano teacher, Harriet the grandmother or even Rose herself. Is the person Stella's supposed to protect the one she needs protection from?

Through a clever ruse, Stella puts a copy of her fake decision in the case sticking out of her handbag for all of the Barclay family to see. She leaves the room to give them an opportunity to snoop. This forces the hand of the person involved in the nanny's death to take action. When she gets too close to the truth her own life becomes threatened.

While trying to determine who should have custody of Rose, she also revisits the death of her own mother when she was seven years old. Her quest reveals facts that she did not know until she is able to secure her mother's file from a detective who is also investigating Tina's death.

Secrets are revealed. People are not what they seem. There are many twists that the reader does not anticipate. i could not wait to turn the pages to see what would happen next until the suspenseful conclusion.


After the presentation we gathered around tables to enjoy refreshments.

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# "I WANT TO BE ABLE TO STAY IN MY HOME" - ALLEN BORNSTEIN

WHEN OLDER-ADULT HOMEOWNERS effectively leverage the equity in their homes, it can be a real game changer for their retirement.

A Home Equity Conversion Mortgage (or HECM, commonly called a reverse mortgage) is a home-secured loan, specifically designed for homeowners 62 and older, that enables the borrower to convert a portion of their home equity into cash and defer repayment until a later date.

With a HECM, the flow of funds is typically reversed—the lender or servicer is the one making the payments to the borrower. A good way to think of it is that lender is giving you an advance on your home's equity. In practical terms, home equity is the current market value of the home minus any liens against the property (e.g., the current balance on a first mortgage).

The borrower's age, the interest rate, and the home value all factor into how much of the home's equity the borrower can initially access with a HECM.

Of course, a HECM is not is not free money. Just like a traditional mortgage, with a HECM, the borrower must repay the borrowed amount, plus interest and fees. However, a HECM offers the borrower much greater repayment flexibility compared to a traditional mortgage—it is a feature that can help the borrower to increase their cash flow in retirement. The borrower can choose to pay as much or as little toward the HECM loan balance each month as they would like—or they can choose to make no monthly mortgage payments at all—for so long as they occupy the home as their primary residence and pay the property-related taxes, insurance, and upkeep expenses.

The HECM loan becomes due when one of following maturity events occurs:

- The property is no longer the principal residence of at least one borrower. For example, a HECM would become due if the last remaining borrower passed away or permanently moved to a nursing home. (Note: The due and payable status of the loan may be deferred in certain situations in which an eligible non-borrowing spouse is involved.)
- A borrower does not fulfill their obligations under the terms of the loan. For example, a HECM would become due if the borrower failed to pay their property taxes in a timely manner—a requirement for compliance with the loan terms.

When the HECM loan becomes due, it is typically satisfied through the sale of the home on the open market. If the price that the home sells for is not enough to pay back the loan balance, the FHA guarantees that neither the borrower nor their heirs will be personally liable to pay the difference. This is known as the loan's non-recourse feature. On the flip side, if home sells for more than the loan balance, the borrower (or the heirs) will be able to keep the difference. And, if the heirs choose to purchase the home them-

selves, they can by paying the full loan balance amount, up to 95 percent of the property's appraised value.

If you're interested in getting a HECM loan, you'll have to make sure you're eligible first. Details are below.

- · Age: The borrower must be age 62 or older
- Home Ownership: The borrower must be the owner of the home and the home must have significant equity (e.g., the borrower owns the home free and clear, or the mortgage balance has been substantially paid down).
- Residency: The home must be the borrower's primary residence. (They must live in the home for more than 6 months out of every year.)
- Credit requirements: The borrower must meet minimal credit requirements.

#### Pros:

- You are not obligated to make a monthly mortgage payment, although you can, for so long as you pay the homeowners insurance, property taxes, and general upkeep expenses.
- You retain the title to your home for so long as you meet your loan obligations. As the homeowner, you can remodel your home or even sell it at any time—just like you could if you had a traditional forward mortgage.
- The HECM loan proceeds can be used for just about any purpose. Common uses are to supplement monthly income, establish an emergency fund, and pay for long-term care or home renovations.
- A HECM generally does not affect Social Security or Medicare benefits.
- Almost all of the upfront costs, including reverse mortgage closing costs, can be rolled into the HECM.

#### Cons:

- The unpaid reverse mortgage loan balance grows over time as interest and fees get tacked on.
- You are drawing down on your home equity. In most cases, that means your heirs would have less money (or no money at all) coming to them from that particular asset.
- $\bullet$  Your eligibility to qualify for needs-based programs—such as Medicaid—may be affected.
- The upfront costs tend to be higher for a reverse mortgage than a traditional mortgage, home equity line of credit, or home equity loan.
- A reverse mortgage must be in the first lien position. Any existing mortgage on your home must be paid off in full prior to taking out a reverse mortgage. A borrower can use HECM loan proceeds to pay off an existing mortgage at closing.

In closing, please remember this:

While there are many HECM benefits, each person has unique needs, and sometimes a reverse mortgage is the best fit—and sometimes it is not.
